

Simpsonville Elementary is a school with a history of academic excellence and continues to be an award winning school. Simpsonville has received various awards over the last several years such as Palmetto Gold Awards, Red Carpet, LiveWell Award, Safe Kids, and many others. Our mission is "Preparing students to be productive, respectful, and responsible." We are providing a school environment conducive to learning by promoting character education, as well as civic responsibility. We have enhanced public understanding and support of our school by involving parents and volunteers as partners in our school programs such as Junior Achievement, our morning math program, Hispanic Night, Family Reading Night, Project Fit America, and small group tutoring. Parents have access to current school information through our website. Students have collected canned goods, brought clothing for the Cool Kids Closet, donated stuffed animals for Cuddles for Kids, and raised over \$8,000 dollars for the Heart Association. Success will be measured by standardized tests like MAP, ACT, PASS, ITBS, and AIMSWEB, student classroom performance, logs of teacher conferences, PTA meetings, and staff development. ACT Readiness Levels






