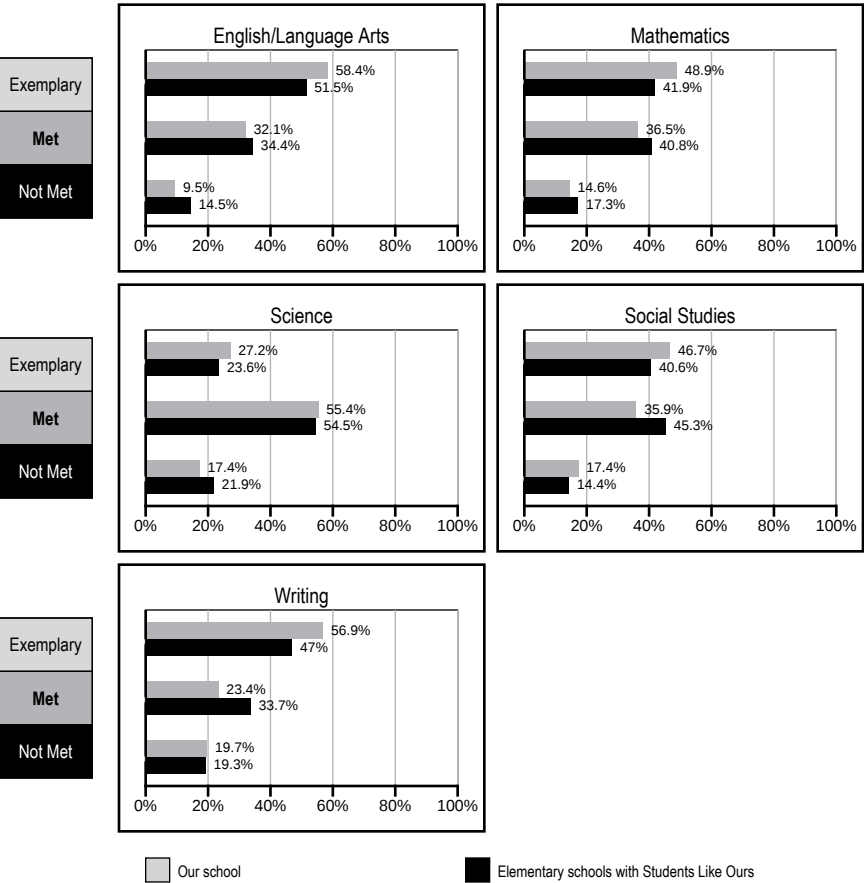

Keowee Elementary School is a Kindergarten-5th grade school that serves 295 students in a rural area of Oconee County, in the upstate of South Carolina. While maintaining its family-friendly atmosphere during the 2008-2009 school year, Keowee Elementary provided data-driven, differentiated and individualized instruction and once again gained recognition by the state as a Palmetto Silver Award-winning school.
