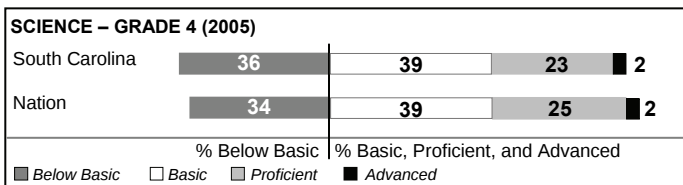
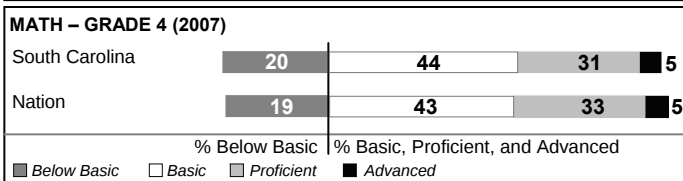
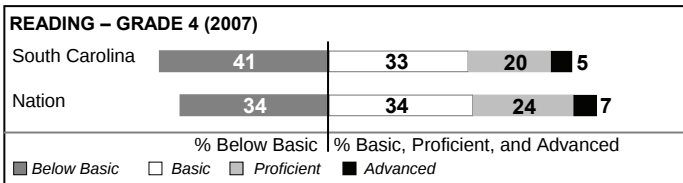
PASS PERFORMANCE
