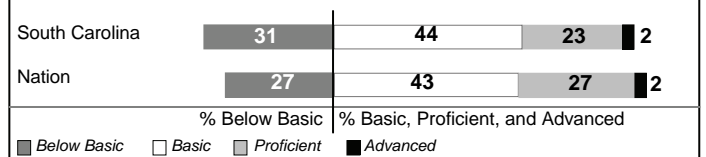

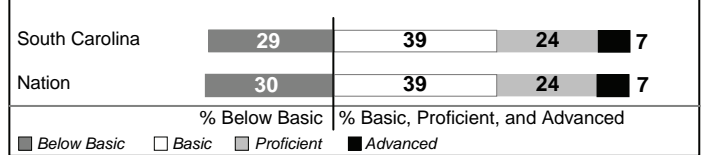

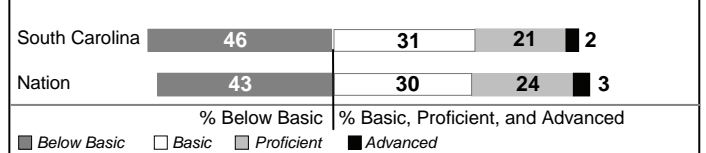
### READING – GRADE 8 (2007)

## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

### Calhoun County High School- "Offering the Total Package"

Calhoun County High School is a small rural school serving approximately 490 students in grades 9-12. The school has a 90.2% graduation rate with 85% of the students receive free or reduced lunch. The 2008-09 focused motto was "We are Ready, Responsible, and Respectful. We are Saints." The faculty, staff, students, and parents were very proud to be named "One of America's Best High Schools" by US News and World Report for a second year. The school's award as a Palmetto Gold recipient was just as rewarding. The dedication of the teachers, hard work of the students, and support of the community continues to bring pride and positive recognition to Calhoun County High School. The school's Absolute and Growth rating of Excellent on the State Report Card and meeting Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) under the No Child Left Behind Act by meeting all 13 objectives for three consecutive years is a result of teachers, students, and parents working as a team to raise the level of academic expectation.

In spite of on-going construction, the use of only half the school, and no bell and intercom system, our teachers continue to promote high expectations by refining the curriculum, reviewing assessment data, and seeking ways to inspire all learners. In an effort to enhance our curriculum, our students participated in the Middle College Program at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College, took career courses at The Orangeburg Consolidated School district Five Technology Center, and participated in inquiry based learning through a USC Diverse Pathways grant. We maintained an after school homework program through a Century 21st Grant and look forward to adding Teen Lead next school year. Other academic initiatives include the continuation of the seven period traditional schedule, ACT/SAT preparation workshops, credit recovery, HSAP/EOC tutorial sessions, grade level parent nights, a college bus tour, implementation of SMARTBoard technology, and data driven decisions.

The ultimate goal of Calhoun County High School is to produce well-rounded, responsible, critical thinking adults. Our boys' varsity basketball team won its fourth consecutive Class A region and State championships. We are proud to say that through teamwork and dedication "CCHS offers the total package." As always, we welcome our parents and the community to join us in our continued march toward success.
