Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Camden Middle School continued in 2008-2009 to excel in academics, athletics, and the fine arts. Our students have progressed in all areas. To increase academic success, Camden Middle School has continued, with great success, the 30- minute Enrichment Class. In all classes, teachers focus on teaching and extending all state curriculum standards. Camden Middle School continued with its mentoring and leadership program. In addition, we have continued monthly clubs to engage students in activities that increase learning and motivation. We teach the Habits of Mind for intelligent thinking as an integral part of our curriculum. Other successes include seven teachers who have achieved National Board Certification. Camden Middle School continues to offer high school credits in Algebra I and English I. More students completed these courses in 2008-2009, and every student passed the End of Course Examination Program. CMS participated in academic and talent search testing. Eighth grade students participated in the PSAT testing. CMS had 15 students named to the SAT South Carolina Junior Scholars Honor Court. Four seventh graders qualified as Duke TIP scholars. Seven seventh graders earned awards in the University of South Carolina Region II Science and Engineering Fair in March 2008. One student represented CMS on the state level at the National Geographic Geography Bee. An eighth grade student was the district winner for the State Superintendent's Writing Award. The Lady Eagles' basketball team was the Conference Champion again for the second year in a row. They are undefeated in two seasons. The CMS Band won numerous awards, including an Excellent Rating at State Concert Festival and Superior Rating at State Jazz Band Festival. Many CMS students earned Excellent and Superior individual ratings as well. The Camden Art Association awarded CMS's art teacher First Place in the Camden Art Association show at the Fine Arts Center of Kershaw County.
