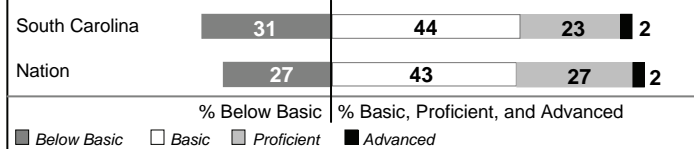

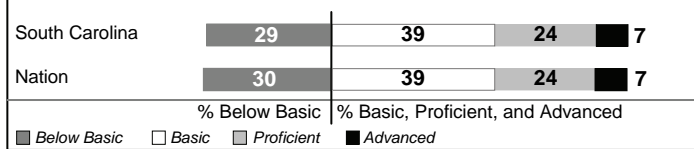

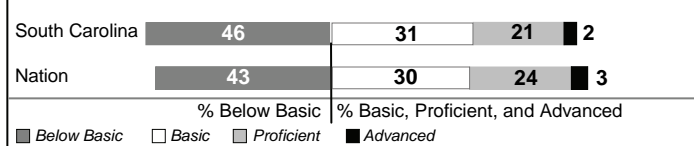
READING – GRADE 8 (2007)

We firmly believe in educating the whole child and developing well-rounded students.
