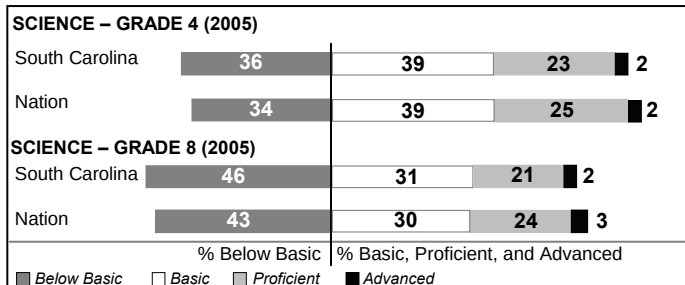
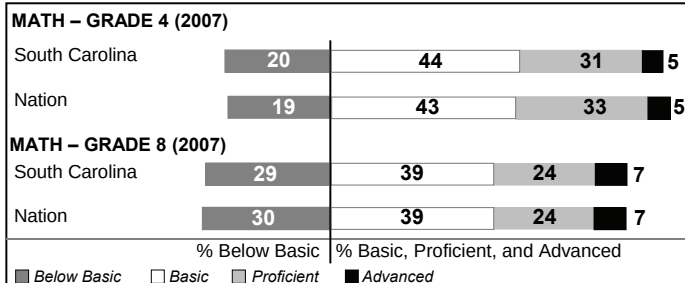
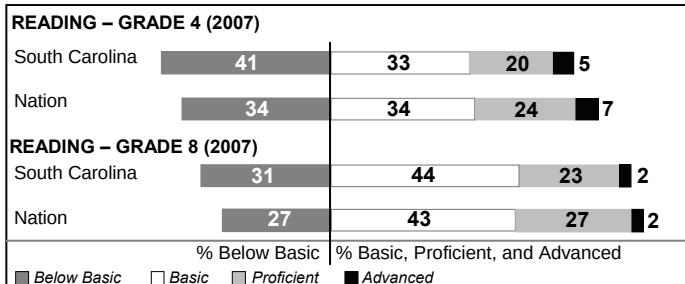

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

School Report Card Narrative 08-09

Hilton Head Early Childhood Center represents best practice in the area of Early Childhood education. Our educational program integrates and supports the arts. Our classroom curriculum is inquiry based and embodies the approach and reflection found in a Reggio Emilia inspired school. Students in kindergarten participate in a full day program; our prekindergarten students are enrolled for a half day program. We serve 301 kindergarten students, and 120 prekindergarten students. We serve 40% of our kindergarten students in an English As A Second Language (ESOL) program. 43 % of our students qualify for free or reduced lunch.

The school hosted a fall and spring Everyday Math Family Night to present and reinforce strategies and concepts introduced through the Everyday Math program instituted district wide this school year. A school wide positive behavior system, BEST, allows all students and adults to have a shared approach to teaching and practicing supportive school behaviors. Our School Intervention Team, guidance counselor, and teachers work with families to identify and monitor students needing academic support. An Instructional Technology Coach provides technology instruction and implements MAPS testing in the fall and spring.

Student achievement reflected the focus on literacy and math instruction. End of year assessments reflected 82 % of kindergarten students scored on or above first grade level in reading. Nationally normed MAP scores indicate 62% of kindergarten students met or exceeded reading and math growth projections in May.

Our community support is strong. We have an active Teacher Parent Advisory Council that hosts school events for students and families. This year parents supported the purchase of risers for our music program. Teachers experience parent appreciation throughout the year. We are truly a team working together to create a positive and progressive experience for the young learner!
