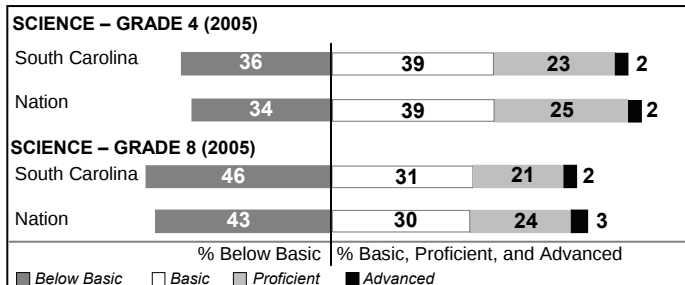
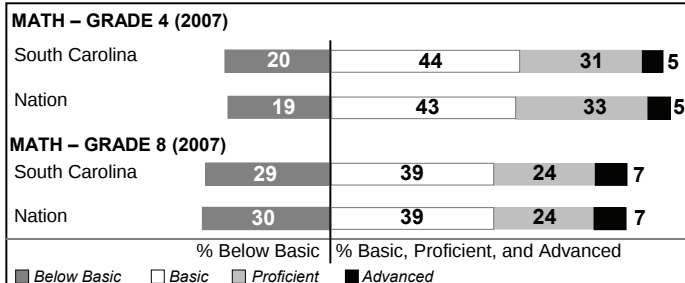
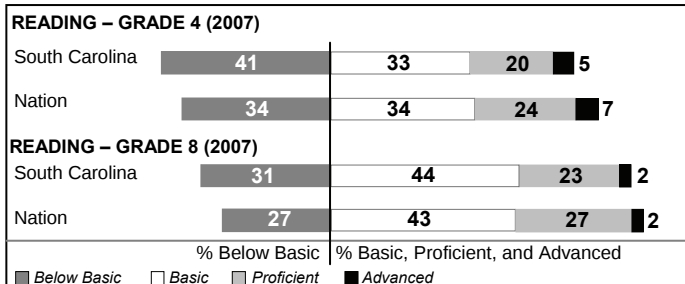

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

There was much excitement when the Lamar Elementary School staff started the year. Even though we did not meet AYP for the 2008-2009 school year, we made improvements through hard work, dedication, and Title I assistance.

Playstations with standards-based disks were available for parents to sign out. The children continued to be assisted by the Student Success Team. The SuccessMaker lab for first and second grade students continued. Kindergarten students received additional help from the Waterford computer program. Small groups of first and second grade students that scored Below Benchmark in reading received help from two interventionists. The Reading Mastery program, which gives supplementary help to all kindergarten, first, and second grade students, continued.

Lamar Elementary continued to be a part of the Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) reading and behavior program. All students were assessed using the Dominie Reading Assessment and the DIBELS Reading Assessment three times during the school year. Students were placed in reading groups based on this data. Teacher training for the Dominie Reading assessment and Reading Mastery was also provided. Through the Rigby Reading series and Title One assistance, all students received small group reading instruction.

The new teacher of the year is Miss Kenyatta Peterson. Out of our 24 teachers, nine have a Masters plus thirty, ten have a Master's Degree, and one holds a doctorate. The other four have Bachelor's degrees. Two teachers are Nationally Board certified.

Lamar Elementary PTA continued to support the school by purchasing a gazebo and sliding board for the playground and by funding a Family Fun Day, Teacher Appreciation Week, and various other needs of the school. A school store to promote positive behavior was also maintained by the PTA. The School Improvement Council was active and helped shape the school climate and to strengthen the instructional program. It also assisted in the updating of the school improvement plan. Lamar Elementary faculty and staff will continue to strive for excellence and to educate all our children to the best of our abilities.
