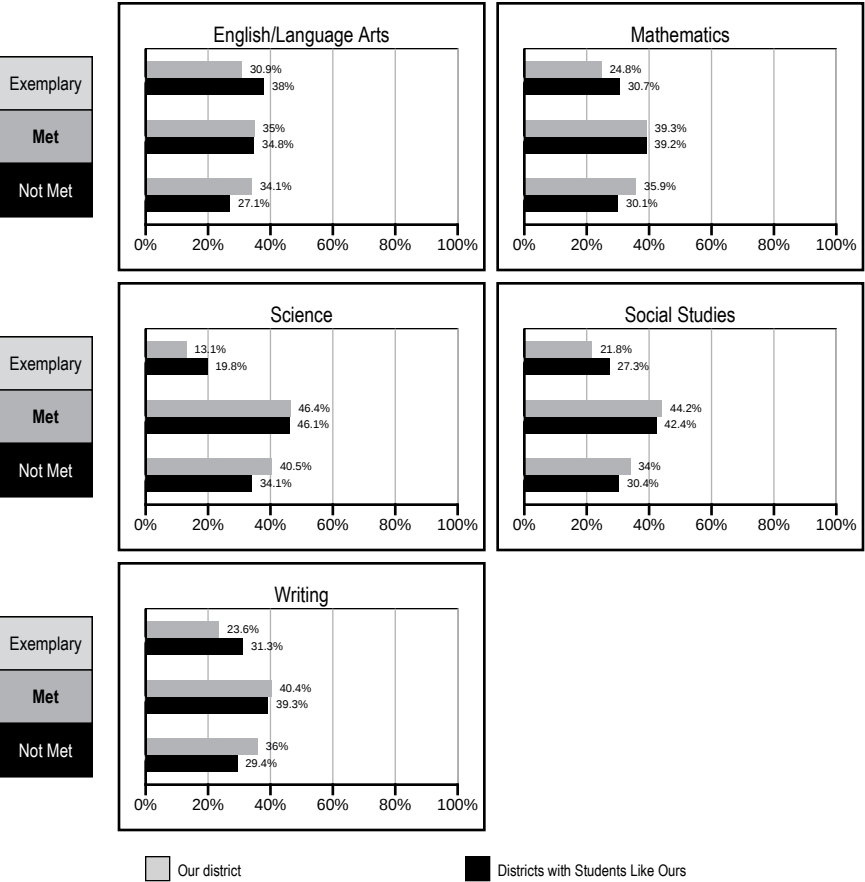

We continue to enjoy many successes in our school district. Our district graduation rate was the third highest in the state, and all three high schools were recognized as Palmetto Gold Award winners. Newberry and Whitmire were recognized for overall performance, with Mid-Carolina being recognized for closing the achievement gap. In the "Districts like Ours" category, we were 1st in graduation rate, 2nd in absolute rating, and 6th in growth rate. Our overall absolute rating improved, as well as the absolute rating in six of our schools. Six schools met AYP, and Little Mountain Elementary received a Palmetto Gold Award for overall performance.

While continuing to enjoy many successes, the focus of this district and our schools is for all students' continuous improvement. We are diligent in looking for opportunities to expand our choice options even as we face a most difficult budget year. Montessori at the elementary level and single-gender at the middle level have proven to be very successful options for our students and parents. Many of our high school students take advantage of our dual-credit offerings in conjunction with a wide variety of virtual classes.

Our successes are achieved through the efforts and commitment of our dedicated trustees, capable administrators, and talented Faculty and Staff.

We realize that support from our families and the community is essential to the overall development of our students. Although we celebrate our successes, we remain committed to providing the best educational experience possible for the students of Newberry County.
