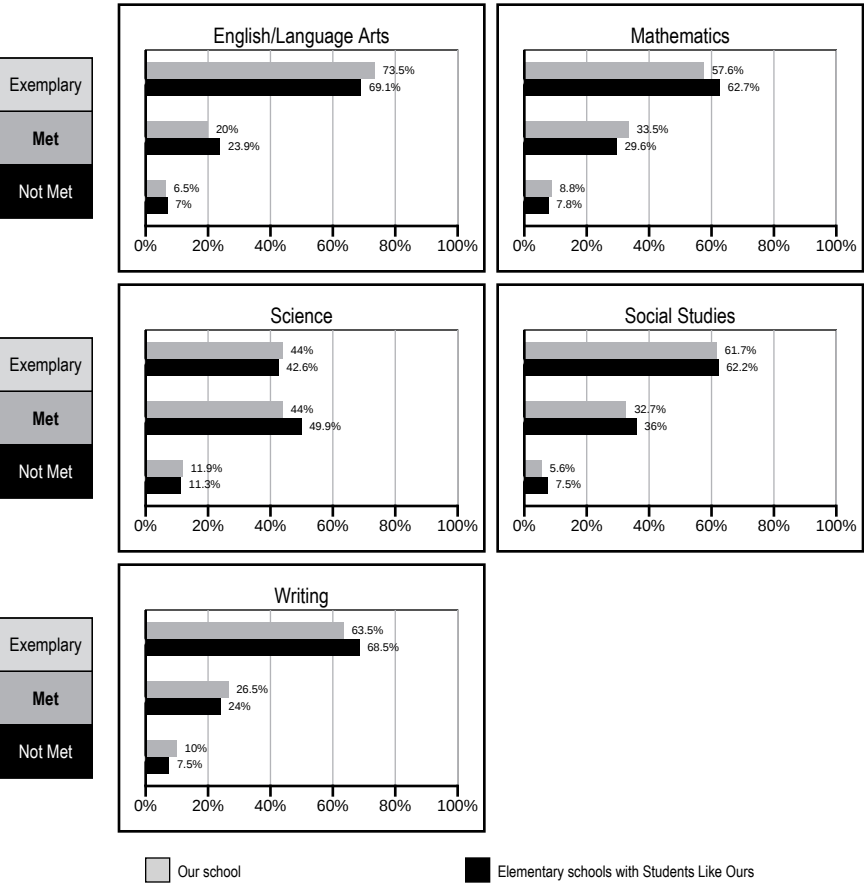

This narrative has been prepared to share some of the many goals and achievements made possible through the powerful synergy of the teachers, parents students, and community members of the Sullivan's Island Elementary School Family. I write this annually for our state record, long before the first day of school or the results of the State Testing (PASS) is available. By the time this narrative is published, our school will have moved into the Sullivan's Island Elementary School Swing Space at the old Whitesides campus on Rifle Range Road. We are optimistic as we Relocate, Remodel, and Rebuild. During this exciting, yet transitional time, I feel confident that we will succeed in maintaining our status of the top-scoring elementary school in our district and continue to provide a whole-child approach to learning.

I am pleased to report that during the 2009-2010 school year, we received a rating of Excellent/Excellent on our State report card and that our overall numeric score was the highest of all of the elementary schools in Charleston County School District.

As we continue to maintain tried-and-true techniques, we will be forging relationships with several community groups, corporations, and universities to focus our curriculum on the international environment, most specifically honing in on hands-on experiences using our coastal location, changes in how we address math and science standards, and changes in scheduling to accommodate these advancements.

I know that we will continue our tray stacking, composting, and gardening efforts as we involve school and community in our ongoing environmental focus that we are keeping on the cutting-edge and linking directly to the students' studies. Other wellness initiatives involve special activities in PE and recess, working with the cafeteria, and partnerships with businesses such as Bi-Lo.

The Charleston County School District literacy initiative, Response to Intervention (small groups for extra help), First Grade Academy (special reading help in 1st grade), Spanish class (all grade levels), and expanded opportunities for clubs and advanced interventions are goals that we, as a school community, are still addressing and making excellent progress with to engage all children.
