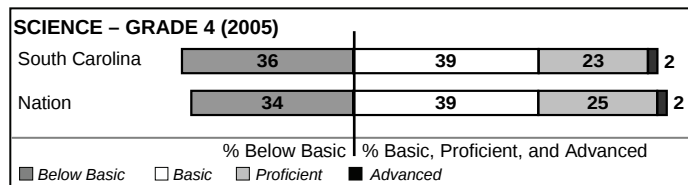
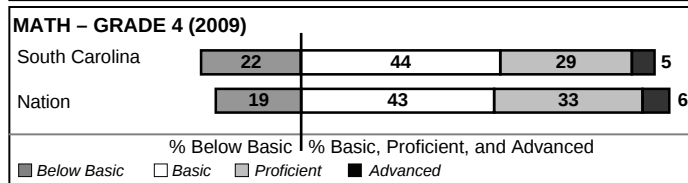
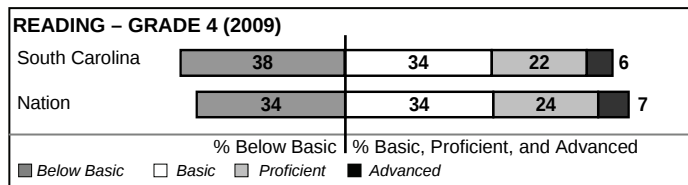
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The Cliffs Valley Community serves our school with many volunteers who tutor and mentor students.
