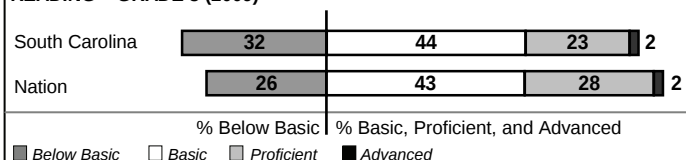

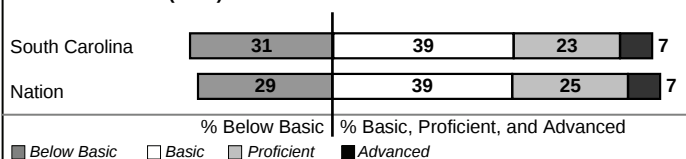

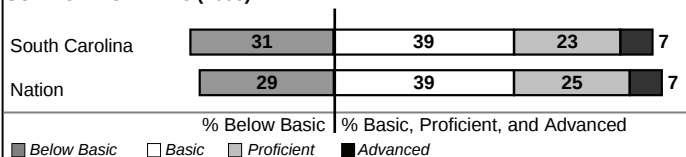
READING - GRADE 8 (2009)

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

2009-2010 was a banner year for Strom Thurmond High School. For the first time in the history of the school, we were named a Red Carpet school by the State Department of Education. Strom Thurmond High School's active School Improvement Council was named an Honor Roll SIC by the state. We are proud to be a High Schools That Work site and had a successful year of implementation. Our Principal was selected to present at the National High Schools That Work conference in Kentucky. Once again, our SAT scores were above the state average, and we continue to offer a variety of AP courses to challenge and meet the needs of our students. The senior class was awarded numerous scholarships to a variety of colleges and universities. It is with pleasure that we developed and established the Thurmond Statesmen Institute, which provides students with a focus on justice and leadership.

Strom Thurmond High School had an outstanding sports year, highlighted by the girls golf individual state champion. Our football team won the region championship with an undefeated region record. The boys track team enjoyed another successful season on the way to a region championship. Strom Thurmond High School was a recipient of our region sportsmanship award from the South Carolina High School League for the second year in a row.

Our Rebel Regiment band had a great year and finished 4th in the state. Strom Thurmond's Mock Trial team was a state finalist, and our NJROTC program placed in several competitions they entered. Our talented drama students put on a world class show for our community.

Strom Thurmond High School has high expectations for all students and will continue those high expectations for years to come.
