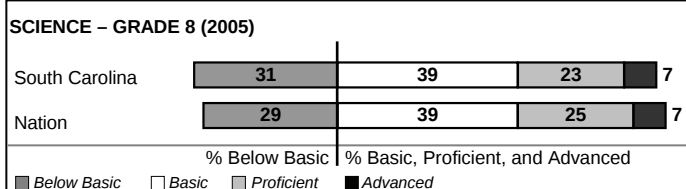
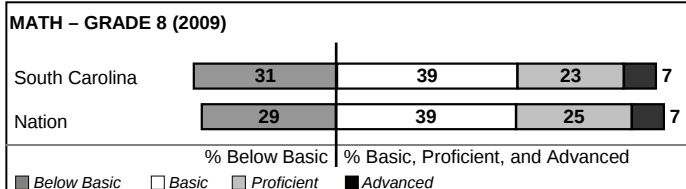
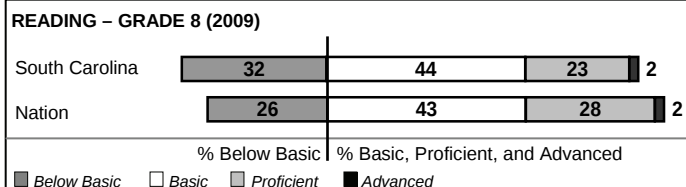
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2009-2010 school year was another successful year for Sangaree Middle School. The primary commitment of increasing student achievement remains the main focus of the School Improvement Council and the Sangaree Middle School faculty and staff.

In an effort to maximize learning opportunities for our students, we continue to implement the 10 key practices of the Making Middle Grades Work Network. During the 2009-2010 school year, Sangaree Middle School focused on improving and varying teaching strategies. We continue to use the feedback provided by the Making Middle Grades Work Technical Assistance Team Visit from November 2007 to focus on rigor, relationships, and relevance for the Sangaree students.

Academic opportunities at Sangaree Middle School include participation in academic competitions and high school credit class options. Sangaree Middle School offered high school credit in the following areas: Algebra I, Algebra II, English I, French I, and Keyboarding Applications. Academic teams participated in the Quest Competition; for the first time, the Sangaree Middle School Level II Social Studies Quest Team placed 3rd in the Lowcountry Competition. We had 17 students qualify as Junior Scholars based on their excellent performance on the PSAT, and one 7th grade student qualified as a Duke Tip Scholar. We had one eighth grade student that placed 1st in the Berkeley County School District Spelling Bee.

In addition to various academic opportunities, Sangaree Middle School strives to promote growth in the arts. The visual arts department received numerous awards during the school year, including 15 Coastal Carolina Art Awards and six students participated in the Doodle for Google Competition. Sangaree Middle School was the Race to Cut Waste District Recycling Winner.

Our commitment to accountability is redefined by our demonstrated successes. We are proud of our accomplishments, and we are ready to face the 2010-2011 school year.
