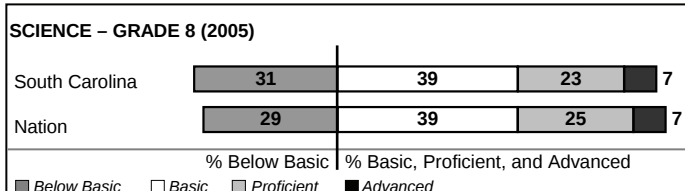
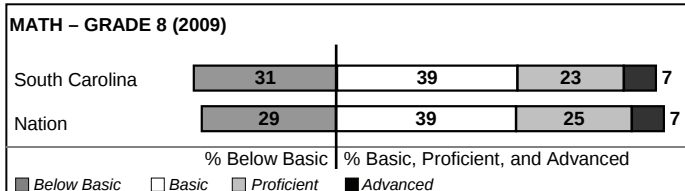
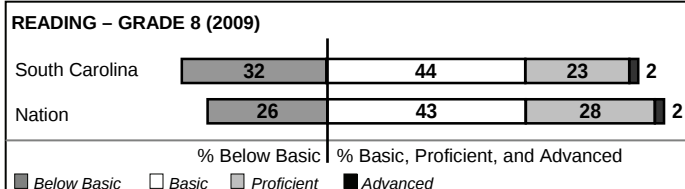
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Edgewood Middle had a very successful year in 2009-2010! We are extremely proud of the fact that our students and staff worked hard to make gains on our annual School Report Card. We jumped two levels on the EAA rating scale for improvement and made a one level gain on the absolute rating. We can attribute these gains to multiple factors. We continued our focus on school-wide literacy by encouraging students to read 25 books annually. Students were recognized for successfully completing increments of five books throughout the year, and students who met the goal of 25 were recognized and rewarded with a book talk luncheon off campus. Teachers also focused on activities that concentrated on improving literacy across the curriculum.

Our Algebra I program continued to be a success with a 97% pass rate for the EOCT. This was the first year of Edgewood's After School program. 100% of the students receiving academic support through the program met grade level requirements. This was also the first year of PASS testing, and we are pleased with our baseline data as we move forward. MAP continues to be a strong indicator of potential performance for PASS, and our data shows continued progress. MAP data is extremely helpful in designing classroom instruction and meeting individual student needs.

Edgewood continues to be successful in many other areas. We maintained our excellent partnership with the South Carolina Army National Guard and the "Stay on Track" program. Our focus is to help every student set goals to remain tobacco, drug and alcohol free for life! The third year of our school-wide anti-bullying program (Success) focused on the Pyramid of Success program founded by Coach John Wooden. This program teamed teachers and staff to each homeroom in order to improve and build student/teacher relationships. Success classes also integrated career education. Students applied knowledge of the Pyramid of Success character traits to careers; developing an understanding that positive character traits lead to success in life. Our Career program included many classroom speakers from the community who related job skills to specific content areas. Additionally, our annual Career Day once again had over 25 business and agency participants. All of our students participated in Job Shadow Day through either a real world or virtual experience.

Professionally, our staff attended many professional learning opportunities and increased efforts to use data analysis for improving instruction. It is the continued efforts of our staff that made 2009-2010 a success and will continue to move us forward. Our PTO and SIC are a successful support system. The SIC spent last year looking to build better relationships with parents and the community in addition to finding ways to support the instructional program. The PTO once again supported the annual academic awards banquet and many other activities that made 2009-2010 special for students and staff. We expect that the 2010-2011 school year will be even better than the previous one. We want all our students to succeed! Drop by Edgewood to see learning and achievement in progress! Success is our only option!
