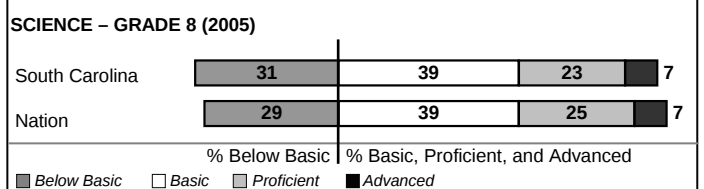
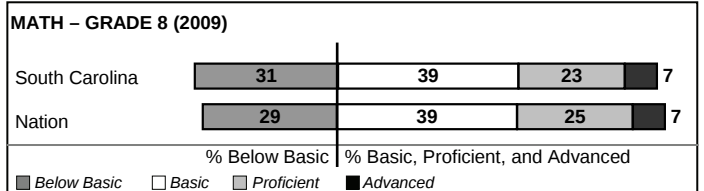
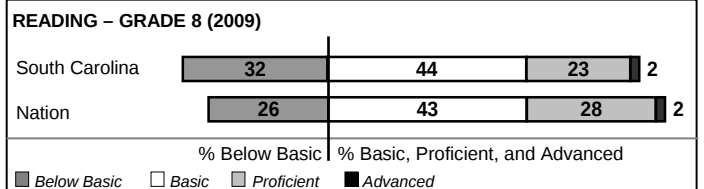
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2009-2010 school year was filled with many accomplishments as well as typical middle school challenges. We embraced the new report card ratings with growth in three out of the four content areas on PASS. We continued with increased technology efforts that included adding SMART Boards to our related arts classrooms, Smart Response "clickers," and each teacher maintained a faculty webpage to increase parent communication. We had several students recognized as Junior Scholars and several that participated in the Duke Tip program. We added a competitive Technology Student Association to our club list. The Bands of NMS received a Superior rating from the Dixie Classic Festival (Richmond, VA), a Superior rating from the Carowinds Music Festival, and an Excellent rating from the SCBDA State Festival. Our chorus competed at the SCMECA competition and received an Excellent Rating. Athletically, we were proud to have an undefeated boys basketball team and 7th-grade football team.

Our teachers were afforded the opportunity to participate in an Internal Instructional Assessment Review and received professional development on how to write on-target assessments. We completed a book study on Do You Know Enough About MeTo Teach Me? by Stephen Peters as we challenged all teachers to build appropriate relationships with students.

We will continue to dedicate our efforts to educating and engaging the students of Newberry Middle School where, "The Standard is Excellence!"
