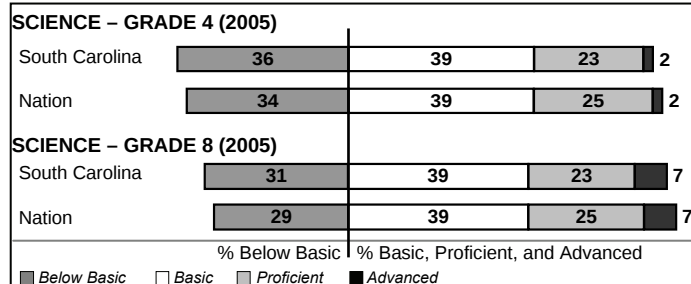
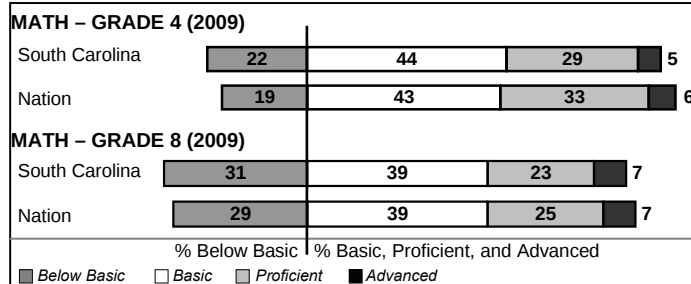
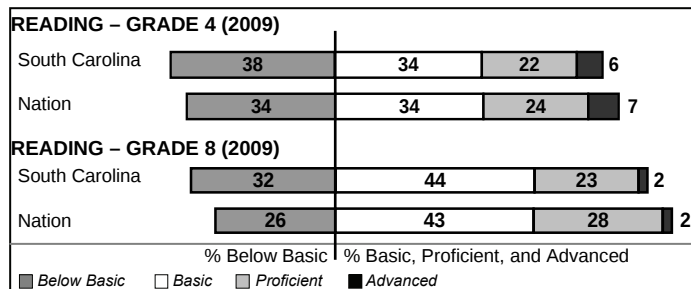

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

2009-2010 was another amazing year at Berkeley Elementary School. BES was again selected as a State School of Character for South Carolina based on its "Peaceful School" model. BES also was recognized at the national level with the Profile in Character Award through the Character Education Partnership.

Berkeley Elementary School provides an exceptional learning environment. The school again received an excellent rating on its 2009 report card. The child development and kindergarten programs are accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). BES is deemed exemplary by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS CASI) accreditation process.

Student achievement improved in all areas assessed. The Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills results are as follows: Kindergarten students demonstrated 75% low risk in Letter Naming Fluency and improved from 86% to 91% established in Phoneme Segmentation. Eighty-two percent of kindergarten students are at low risk in Nonsense Word Fluency (NWF). Ninety-seven percent of first grade students are established in the area of phoneme segmentation. Nonsense word fluency improved from 78% to 82% established. Sixty-seven percent are at low risk in Oral Reading Fluency (ORF). Second graders demonstrated 62% low risk in ORF. This is the second year that first graders were tested using the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment. First grade students improved from 63% to 70% at or above the 50th percentile in reading and from 59.6% to 61.8% at or above the 50th percentile for mathematics. Second grade student MAP scores improved from 55.4% to 67.1% at or above the 50th percentile in Mathematics. MAP reading scores also improved from 55% to 59% of the students at or above the 50th percentile.

Students participate in school and community programs that enhance development and promote citizenship. These programs include Kiwanis "Terrific Kids" character education, Berkeley County Kids Who Care ecology awareness, Junior Achievement, Maestro Club, and the Northwoods Mall Art Show. Students receive mentoring from volunteers and the high school's teacher cadet program. Santee Cooper is our major business partner. This year the school received grants from BP Energy and the State Department of Education that helped the school to utilize energy activities and enhance the mathematics curriculum and technology to improve its AYP status.

Our staff increases their professional knowledge through staff development and coursework. There are eight Nationally Board Certified teachers on staff. Parents are an integral part of the school and serve on the PTO and the School Improvement Council (SIC). The SIC team members meet throughout the school year to review annual goals.

Berkeley Elementary School fosters an environment of success and appreciation for all students, staff, parents, and community. We will continue to provide partnerships that will ultimately help our students reach their maximum potential.
