**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**

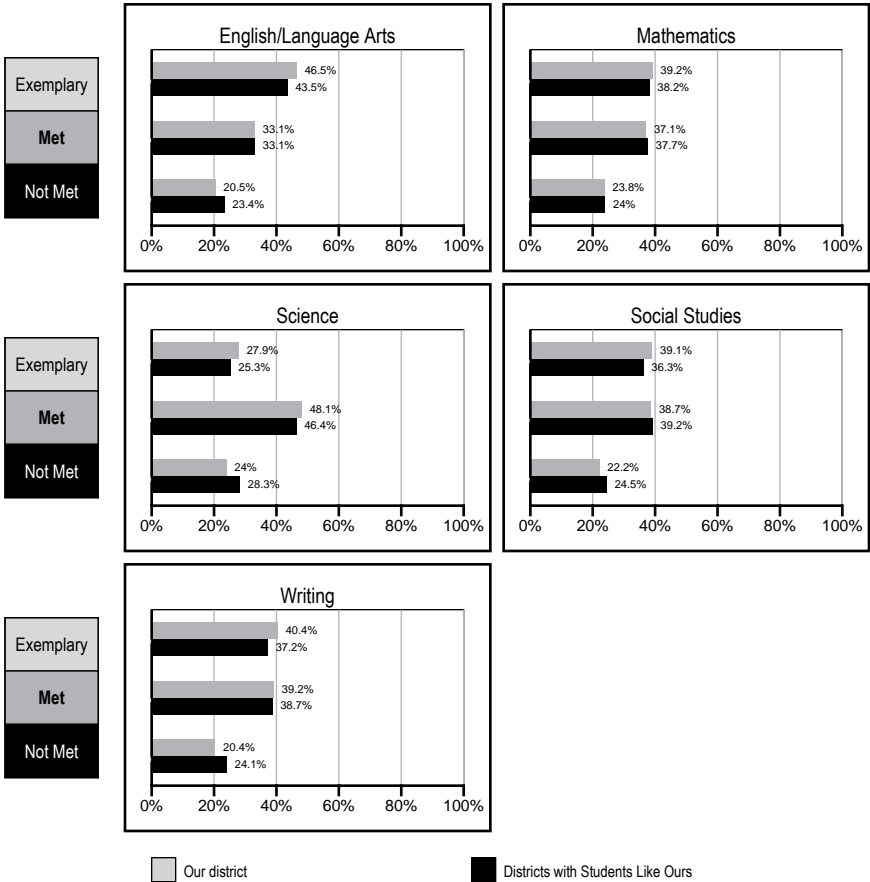

## District Superintendent's Report

In 2010-2011, the School District of Pickens County faced enormous challenges as the effect of reduced state funding was felt in all areas of district operations. Budget decisions eliminated positions that eroded support for classroom teachers. Supply money was reduced, and scheduled technology upgrades were postponed. Still, the School District of Pickens County marked accomplishments.

By reducing expenditures and implementing cost-saving measures in FY10, SDPC maintained a strong financial position and increased the General Fund's undesignated/unreserved balance over \$1,000,000. External auditors praised the leadership for good financial management despite the economic downturn and state cuts.

In our instructional program, we continued to focus on high quality learning opportunities that meet needs of our diverse learners. Fourteen schools received Palmetto Gold and Silver awards for general performance as well as for progress in closing achievement gaps. Eight of the fourteen schools received awards in both parts of the recognition program.

As assessment results were released throughout the fall, we received positive news. SDPC students exceeded the state average in every grade in every subject on PASS. Our students outperformed their peers on Algebra 1, English 1, and U.S. History and Constitution end-of-course tests. Students passing the high school exit exam on their first attempt increased slightly.

On the ACT, the district was ranked first in South Carolina for the second consecutive year and exceeded the national average as it has each year since 2006. For the second consecutive year, SAT scores increased, remaining well above the national average.

Crosswell, Holly Springs, Pickens, Six Mile, and West End elementary schools as well as Dacusville Middle, Pickens Middle, and Simpson Alternative Education Center used approximately \$6,500,000 in federal grants to implement the Teacher Advancement Program (TAP). Additionally, A.R. Lewis built on its existing TAP program.

Building Futures, the district's facilities program, moved ahead. While construction of seven new schools continued, renovations began at McKissick Elementary, Dacusville Middle, and Edwards Middle. In October, an approved bond resolution supplied additional funds for a second middle school in Easley and technology upgrades.

By late May, the building program was 56% complete. The new Dacusville Elementary building was dedicated and opened to the public for tours. Five new schools were on track to open for classes in September: Pickens High, Liberty High, Dacusville Elementary, Chastain Road Elementary and the Pickens County Career & Technology Center. Easley High was on schedule for a January 2012 opening.
