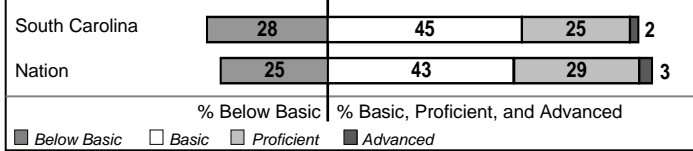
Our School Middle Schools with Students Like Ours Middle schools statewide



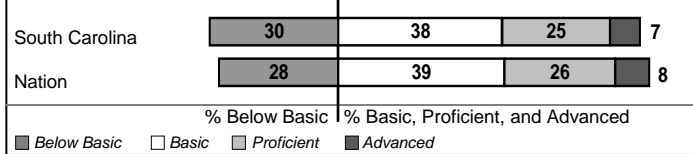

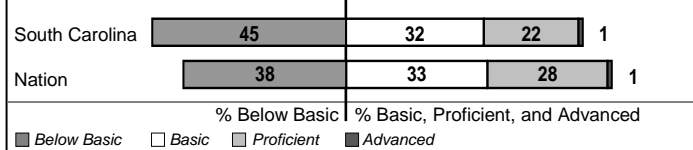
READING – GRADE 8 (2011)

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Buford Middle School's theme for the 2010-2011 school year was "Rowdy for Learning" and this cowboy theme has been incorporated into all aspects of our school year. We began the year by celebrating our top summer readers. Thirty students had a rowdy time with all types of activities on the football field. Later in the year we had a visit from the mechanical bull, which our readers and teachers rode with enthusiasm. We had several book clubs that culminated with a "lunch and a movie" celebration. We had an author visit that followed a school-wide reading initiative and celebrated our end of the year top readers with a white-water rafting trip to Tennessee.

Our teachers have had many reasons to celebrate. At the beginning of the year, one of our teachers was named as the District Middle School Teacher of the Year. This brought our count to five teachers who have had this wonderful distinction. We had another teacher receive National Board certification, which brought our total count to 8 teachers. Most of our teachers received their Gifted and Talented Certification this year. We have all participated in Professional Learning Communities this year to keep our skills and talents innovative.

Our students have also done incredibly well. We have had three 7th graders receive recognition as Duke Tip Scholars. We have had twelve 8th graders recognized as Junior Scholars. Our students raised money for one of our teachers who was diagnosed with cancer. They also participated in Relay for Life, Pennies for Patients, Hoops for Hearts and bringing canned goods for Hope of Lancaster. We strive to raise good citizens that give back to the community.
