Report of Director and School Improvement Council

Enoree Career and Technology Center is located in Northern Greenville County, south of Travelers Rest. The center was built in 1973, and a four million dollar renovation was completed during the 2005 school year. Enoree Career and Technology Center serves students primarily from Berea, Carolina, Travelers Rest, and Wade Hampton High School; however, students from any Greenville County high school may elect to attend the center for specialized career courses. The programs/ courses taught at Enoree include Automotive Collision Repair, Automotive Technology, Building Construction, Gerontology, Medical Terminology, Health Science, Cosmetology, Early Childhood, Emergency Responder, Pharmacy Tech, Law Enforcement, Graphic Arts, Fashion Merchandising, Career Development/ Rotation, Sports Medicine, and Web Page Design. Many of the courses taught at Enoree are dual-credit or have an articulation agreement in place with Greenville Tech. All programs are offered in accordance with the standards established by the SC State Department of Education Office of Career and Technology Education. Our Cosmetology students had a 100% success rate on the State Cosmetology Certification for the fourth straight year. Our Law Enforcement students had a 100% success rate in the National Dispatch Certification Exam with one student scoring a perfect score. Our Gerontology program had 85% success rate on their National Certification Exam. Building Construction has received National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) certification. Our Health Sciences department meets DHEC standards and the Gerontology program is certified by the State of South Carolina. Our Emergency Responder program receives Red Cross certification in CPR and AED. Every second year student received academic assistance by using the WIN Employment skills training software and 81% of these students received a Work Keys Employment Skills Certificate. Enoree selects students of the month in each program at the school. Students of the year in each program were recognized at the Center's awards day, as well as director's awards winners, citizenship awards winners and scholarship recipients. Outstanding students are awarded membership in the National Technical Honor Society. Enoree offers single semester introduction courses in almost every program at the center. This change in scheduling, along with the staff's recruitment efforts, has resulted in a dramatic increase in enrollment over the past five years. Enoree maintains a great degree of flexibility in classes and curriculum in order to meet the needs of our students, their home base schools, and the community around us. Our goal is to prepare our students for the next step, whether it is entering the work force or continuing their education in a post-secondary environment.

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
