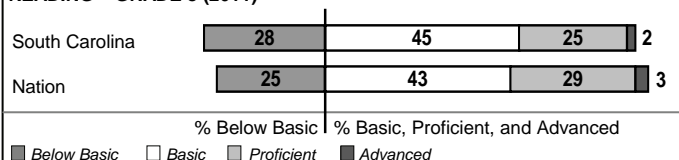

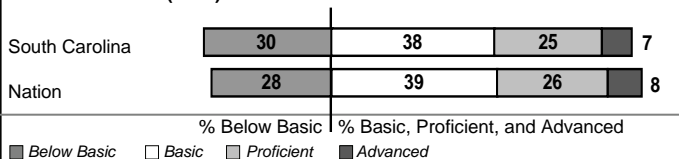

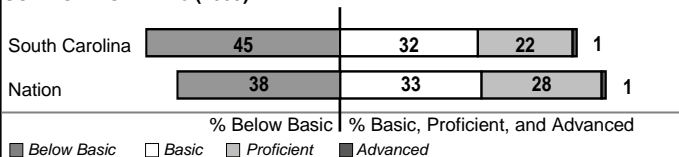
READING – GRADE 8 (2011)

REPORT OF DIRECTOR AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

BJ Skelton Career Center has moved into a new facility with a new name, the Pickens County Career and Technology Center. With our new facilities and new name there is a new atmosphere and culture of work in our building. Our four core values are: Responsibility, Respect, Discovery and Excellence. The faculty and staff at the Pickens County Career and Technology Center strive to: enable our students to be thoughtful stewards of all our resources; be accountable to ourselves, each other and the public we serve; therefore, becoming Responsible citizens in society. We aim to foster in each student a Respect for one's self and an appreciation of others. We strive to help each student trust in the process of Discovery in all learning and to pursue Excellence through diligent effort, both individually and collectively. The Pickens County Career and Technology Center is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. We have identified goals aligned with the Technology Centers That Work (TCTW) school improvement initiatives in order to focus for continuous improvement. Action plans have been developed to address the TCTW goals, which are also aligned with our accreditation goals. The Carl Perkins Standards for our state have changed and we are ramping up our efforts to meet the new bench marks. This year we completed staff development as a faculty to improve our instructional skills and to better understand the learning process. As our students are applying the Discovery process to their learning, staff members are also developing our teaching abilities and learning by discovering new strategies of teaching. We strive for Excellence in our instructional focus. The taxpayers of Pickens County can be proud of the new facilities and of the accomplishments of the Pickens County Career and Technology Center. We continue to develop new partnerships with the local businesses and industries in the area. Many of our students involved in Career and Technology Student Organizations will be representing the Pickens County Career and Technology Center and the State of South Carolina in National events this summer. We had 21 state gold medal winners this year.
