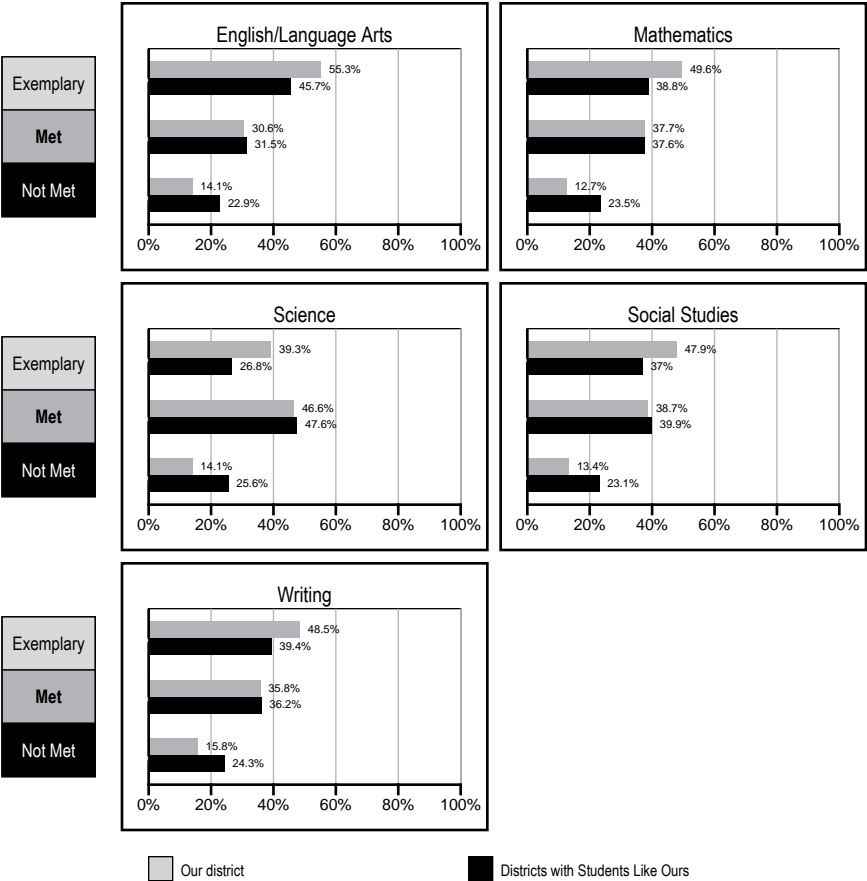

**District Superintendent's Report**

The 2011-2012 school year proved to be an outstanding year for the students, teachers, staff, and community of Spartanburg School District One. Our focus continued to be "Student Centered Education" as we served approximately 5,100 students with top quality programs and opportunities.

Spartanburg School District One continued the tradition of high academic goals through the dedication and support of our staff, parents, and Board of Trustees through their commitment and understanding of the shared goals established for the district.

A rigorous assessment for national accreditation from Advanc-Ed was conducted by an outside team as part of a five year cycle of review during 2011-2012. The visiting team was composed of members from various states across the country. After review, the team recommended Spartanburg School District One for the highest level of national accreditation. The findings of the visiting committee included commendations for "visible, responsive leadership that fosters trust and autonomy; and effective instruction resulting in high student achievement".

For high levels of absolute performance and/or rates of growth, the South Carolina Department of Education awarded the Palmetto Gold and Silver to Campobello-Gramling Elementary, O.P. Earle Elementary, Holly Springs-Motlow Elementary, Inman Elementary, Inman Intermediate, New Prospect Elementary, Landrum Middle School, T.E. Mabry Middle School, and Landrum High School.

Spartanburg School District One continued to be committed to the importance of literacy and reading. O.P. Earle was selected as the State's Exemplary Reading School of the Year by the South Carolina International Reading Association. Inman Intermediate and Landrum Middle were named "honor schools". Inman Elementary was honored with their principal being named as Spartanburg County's Reading Administrator of the Year.

This year's graduating seniors earned over \$8.3 million dollars in academic achievements and scholarships. Student scores on PASS, ACT, and SAT continued to be among the highest scores in the state. The arts program across the district continued to excel with numerous successes and student awards in band, strings, and the visual arts. Athletic programs in our school district had a very successful year as well with Chapman High School and Landrum High School winning 11 Region Championships.

Spartanburg School District One continues the long tradition of excellence. We are so proud and appreciative of our entire District One community, staff, and students. We are excited about the coming years as we work to meet the challenges and continue to work with our students and teachers to "become the best".
