Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

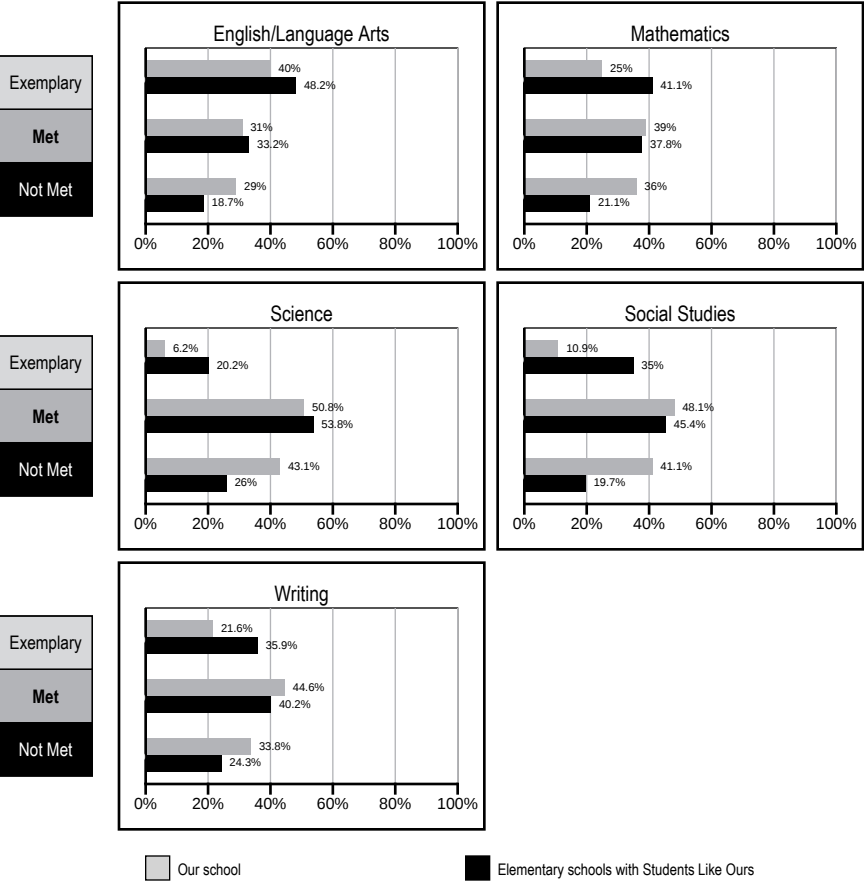

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

During the 2011-2012 year, Kershaw Elementary built on the initiatives of the past two years. We continued our focus on assessing student performance, analyzing data, evaluating instruction and the effective use of technology and resources to enhance student achievement. Family engagement and collaboration with the community remained a top priority. We celebrated successes throughout the year. And, we extended our school-wide theme "Sailing to Success...Around the World in 180 Days" to include ports across the globe.

Through the Professional Teaching and Learning Cycle, teachers met weekly to review student work, analyze data, plan instruction, and to study the newly developed Common Core State Standards. Dominie testing for kindergarten through fifth grade and the implementation of the 100 Book Challenge for kindergarten, first and second grades increased the use of leveled texts and enhanced our ability to meet individual student needs. In addition, several on-line programs allowed students to have access, at home and school, to reading and math skills on their individual levels to support classroom instruction and learning. The afterschool programs provided additional learning opportunities for numerous students.

The support of our families and the community is crucial to our success. Parents showed support by attending Family Nights and PTO/SIC meetings, signing reading logs daily, communicating with teachers and volunteering. In addition, community members participated in our career fair, sponsored Backpack Buddies, provided vision screenings and donated funds for field trips.

Celebrations played a significant role in our school year. Students were recognized daily for making good choices. Each six weeks honor roll events were held and students who met reading goals attended fun activities. We also had numerous visitors for all students including a local author, Sir Purr, and representatives from Winthrop University and Wingate University. Kershaw Elementary received the Palmetto Silver Award from the South Carolina Department of Education based on PASS scores and the growth index for the past three years.

Our theme, "Sailing to Success...Around the World in 180 Days," extended our learning to include other countries and cultures. Social studies, science, math and language arts standards were embedded in activities throughout the year. We are looking forward to the 2012-2013 year with our new emphasis on "United We Stand, United We Learn". This will serve as the foundation for integrated activities that focus on United States history, government and geography.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
