Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating

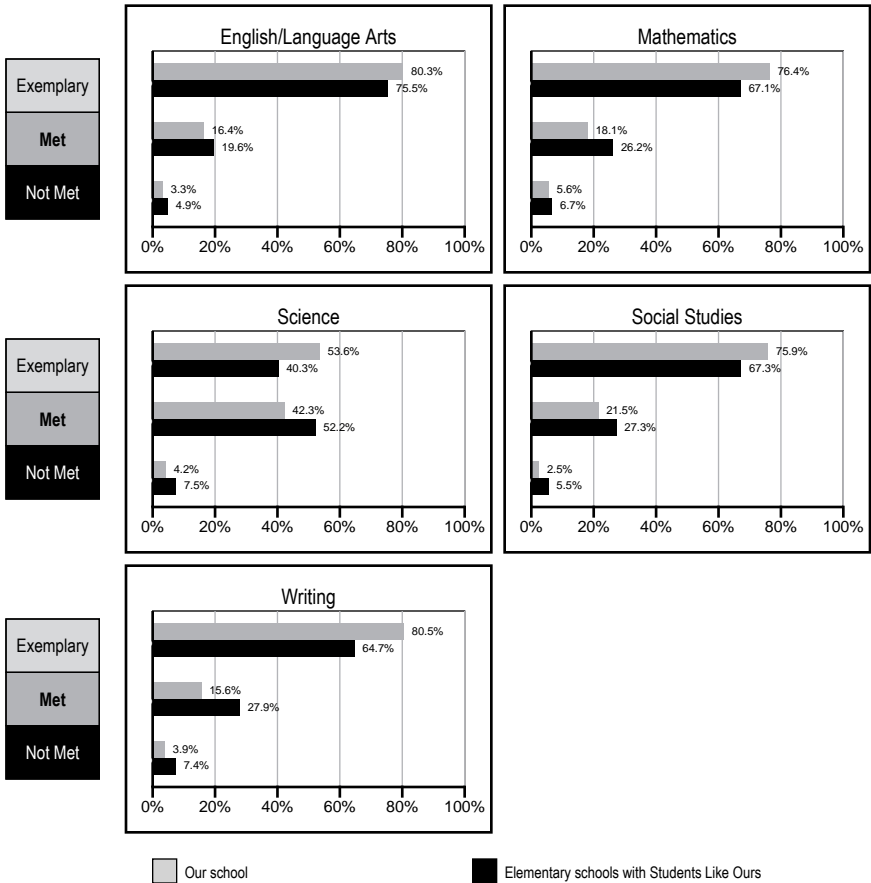

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Our tenth year was a huge gator success! Lake Carolina was recognized for the ninth year for Closing The Achievement Gap for historically underperforming students. We earned an "Excellent, Excellent" Absolute Rating on the SC State Report Card and we achieved Adequate Yearly Progress as well. Again our school earned the Palmetto Gold distinction which is the highest academic honor recognized by the State Department of Education.

Lake Carolina has 26 National Board Certified teachers. In addition, LCE's partnership with the University of South Carolina as a Professional Development School brought 14 interns and student teachers into our school during the course of the year. One hundred percent of our faculty and staff have been trained in brain compatibility and have implemented .

We celebrated our children's growth through honor roll recognitions, Reading Counts celebrations, and Peace Flag celebrations. After school clubs for 4th and 5th grades, as well as Unlimited Hands-On-Science, Lango, karate, cheerleading, dance, sports fundamentals, golf, and gymnastics, offered additional enrichment opportunities for our students. In addition, qualifying 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders had the opportunity to participate in Project Read Tier Two. The LCE Leadership Academy continued to focus on opportunities for 4th and 5th grade boys to learn and build competency skills in leadership. The Lady Leadership Academy continued to foster leadership skills, build healthy self-esteems, and encourage positive relationships. Our Boys and Girls Club program serves 113 children. Our 799 students read 78,871 books and earned over 208,642 Reading Counts points. Each day we averaged 488 books checked out in our Media Center. Two "Literacy at the Lake" books helped to frame our focus of 19 LIFESKILLS and 5 Lifelong Guidelines. Our Cyber Gators competed in the local and state Lego competition. Based on the feedback from our Health Advisory and School Improvement Council surveys, strategies which included Exercise Counts, were implemented to increase our focus on heart healthy living. Our School Improvement Council sponsored an extremely successful uniform sale. Service learning projects selected and supported by our SIC were as follows: PAALS, art donated to the community, Winter Canned Food Drive and educated the community about the items that can be recycled. Our PTO Board also sponsored Family Fun Nights, Gator Fest, father/daughter dance and mother/son bowling night.

Due to the dedication and commitment of TEAM LCE and the support and pride of our parents and community, our accolades are many. However, what we truly cherish is our sense of community where TOGETHER we will continue to "sail beyond excellence" for ALL children at Lake Carolina Elementary School.

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
