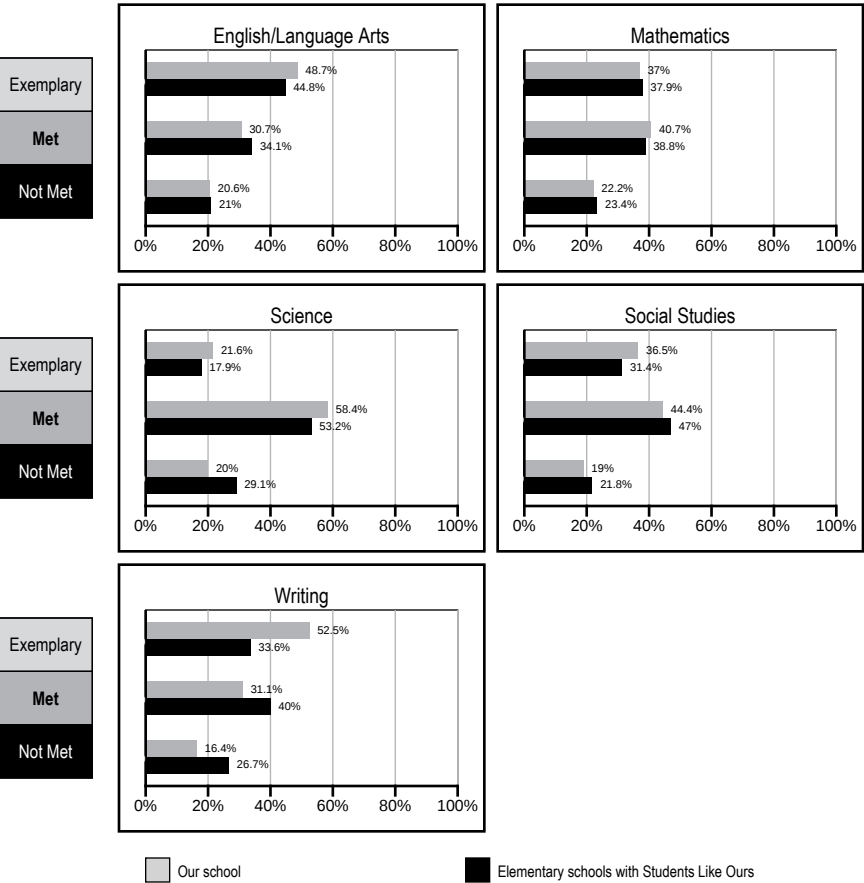

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

"Nothing Could Be Finer" than the learning taking place at Cowpens Elementary School in 2011-2012. Together we worked to build a strong foundation based on data assessment, individualized literacy instruction, hands-on math and science instruction, cutting-edge technology, positive behavior and healthy lifestyle choices. We are proud of our "Good" Absolute Rating and "Good" Improvement Rating on the State Report Card, which are determined by students meeting or exceeding state standards and student growth on the Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS). In addition, we received the Palmetto Silver Award in recognition of significant gains in student achievement and once again met Adequate Yearly Progress. The faculty and staff at Cowpens Elementary are committed to student achievement as demonstrated through quality instruction tailored to the needs of our students.

Our students actively participated in a wide variety of activities throughout the year that included the school-wide reading challenge, Girls on the Run, Mileage Club, sports camps, musical performances, art shows and ATLAS for students who are gifted in music and art. Students received honors for the Governor's Citizenship Award, the Kiwanis' Multiplication Medallion Challenge, the Piedmont Regional Science Fair, the Regional Spelling Bee, Reading Challenge, Positive Behavior, Principal's Honor Roll, Honor Roll, Perfect Attendance and Outstanding Effort.

Our faculty and staff collaborated with district instructional coaches to individualize reading instruction for our students. The CES Teacher of the Year was also named the District Teacher of the Year. In addition, two of our teachers received grants to enrich their classrooms. The Parent/Student Handbook, which extends our communication into the community, received an award for outstanding communications and public relation efforts by schools. Technology continued to drive the curriculum through the use of Promethean Boards, eChalk, interactive Web pages, Photo Story productions, eReaders and interactive assessment devices.

At CES, service to others is an important component of a student's education. Our students were involved in activities to support others such as Winter Warmth for Kids, Giving Warmth the Heart, Holiday Meals, St. Jude's Math-A-Thon, and Meals on Wheels. Over the holidays, our student council provided meals for families and our Southern Signers Club made and delivered over 200 Easter baskets for Meals on Wheels. Students and teachers worked together to raise over \$12,000 for Relay for Life and the American Cancer Society.

Thanks to a hard working faculty and staff, enthusiastic learners, and a dedicated community, achieving success for every child at Cowpens Elementary School is more than a vision, it is a reality.

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
