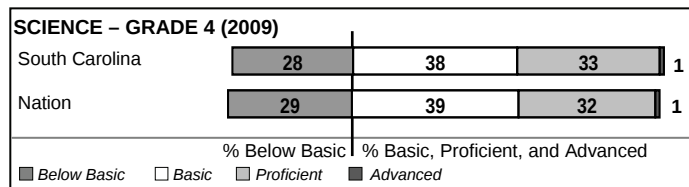
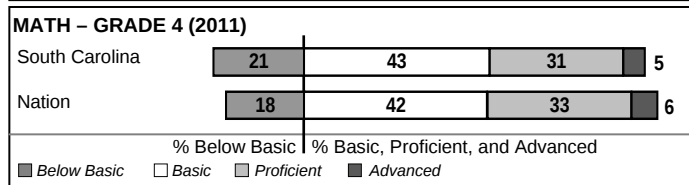
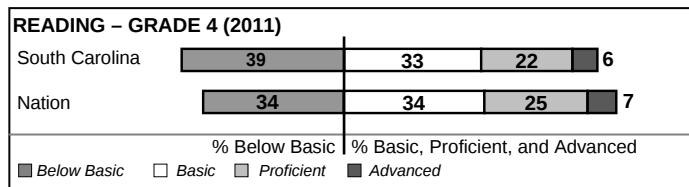
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Mission Statement: A community of learners dedicated to student achievement.

Purpose: The purpose of Carolina Elementary School is to promote academic excellence in each student's life and to establish positive relationships with the entire learning community.

The steps that we take today lead to the successes of tomorrow.

PASS Goals: We are delighted to announce that Carolina Elementary met all the student achievement goals based on Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS) results. Our state report score was: Excellent (Absolute) and Average (Improvement). We scored higher than district and state averages in all grade levels. We did not meet Annual Yearly Progress (AYP) by achieving 15 out of 17 criteria. The data is posted on the district website (darlington.k12.sc.us) and the state website (scde.com). Honors: Carolina was honored as District Clean School of the Year for 2010-2011. Forty-one fifth graders were inducted into the National Junior Beta Club this year.

These students have an academic average of 90 or above and will be able to join the Beta Club at Hartsville Middle School next year. Carolina Elementary received Honorable Mention from the State Schools of Character in March.

Activities: In October, we enjoyed two family activities: the Coker 5K run for any student and parent who wanted to participate and our annual Parent Picnic where all parents were invited to eat a picnic lunch outside with their child. Our "Night of Excellence" was held in February with interactive activities in social studies for parents and students.

School Climate: As part of National Network of Partnering Schools (NNPS) we provided "Drive through Breakfast" to our parents twice during the year. Students enjoy Lunch Bunch, a time when parents and grandparents read aloud to them during their lunch period.

Technology: Carolina benefits from the Darlington County Technology Plan. Parents now have access to their children's grades through the Parent Portal, a web based program. Teachers received training in the new interactive software, ActivInspire. Teachers also received new "netbooks" to replace their laptops for instructional purposes.

Parent Organizations: This year, our goal was new equipment for the playground. In an effort to promote fitness and healthy living, the playground committee, and the PTO decided to raise funds for fitness equipment rather than play equipment for the playground. We received funding from the Byerly Foundation, Pioneering HEALTHIER Communities, Pee Dee Region, JBE and Carolina Elementary PTO. The students are excited about staying fit in a fun way.
