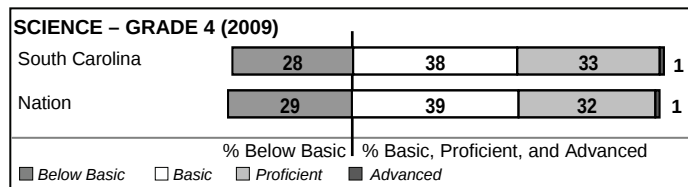
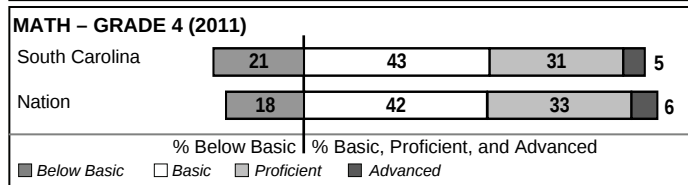
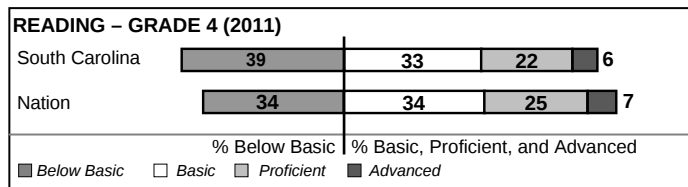
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Throughout the 2011-2012 school year, Williams Memorial Elementary remained consistent in providing its students with a top of the line educational program. The school received a visit from the State Superintendent of Education, Dr. Zais, who recognized WMES for demonstrating that all children are capable of learning at a high level and we were again recognized by the state with the Palmetto Silver Award.

WMES enters its third year as a TAP (Teacher Advancement Program) school, providing teachers with on-going, focused professional development and teacher performance incentives for academic student growth. All of the teachers at WMES are highly qualified, thirteen are Nationally Board Certified, and for the sixth time in as many years, WMES has Dorchester School District Four's Teacher of the Year.

In the classrooms, students are being offered sound standards based instruction through student centered, hands on activities. The teachers analyze all of the data from each of the school's many assessments to develop differentiated learning opportunities through small group instruction, literacy work stations, centers and flex grouping. Beyond the classroom, hundreds of our students excelled in one of our many extra-curricular offerings that included the Art Club, Chorus, Basketball, Cheerleading, Book Club, Math Club, Trebuchet Club, Nature Club, Soccer, TNT News Team, and Recycling Team. Also, in their first year as a club, the Robotics team, The Tigerbots, advanced through regional qualifiers to compete in the state competition in Columbia.

Our parents, grandparents and community members take an active part in the school by volunteering to be on the School Improvement Council or by taking an active role in our very supportive and hard working PTA. Families and community members joined us at our Academic Nights, Grandparent Luncheons, Veteran's Day Luncheons, WMES sporting events and Character Student of the Month breakfasts.

As we close the door on another successful school year, we can say with complete confidence that we are still "Paws"-itively the Best.
