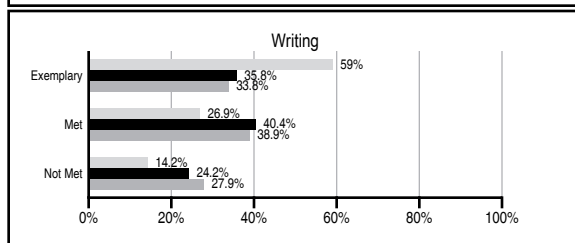

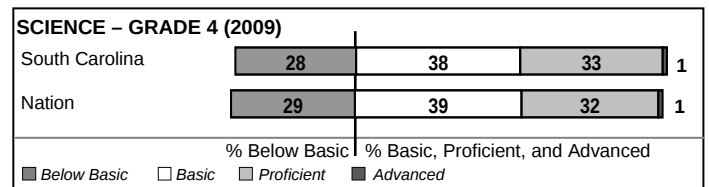
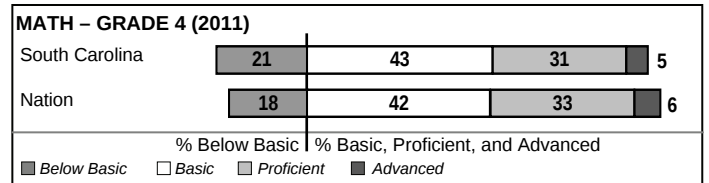
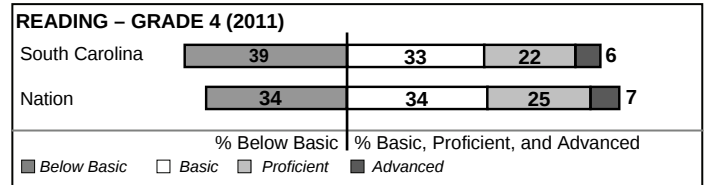
PASS PERFORMANCE
