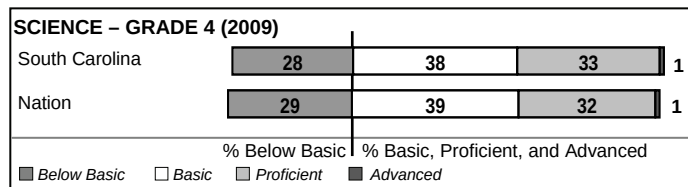
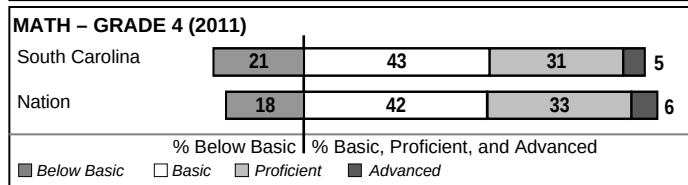
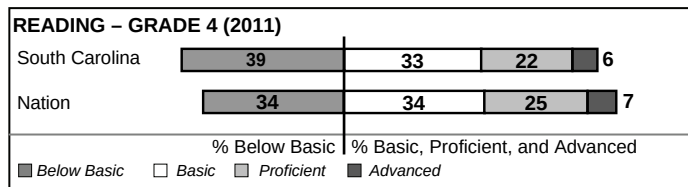
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

We celebrated our tenth anniversary during the 2011-2012 school year! Our "Decade in the Making" has been filled with fun, engaged learning, and continued academic progress. Throughout the year, our faculty, staff, and administration utilized data and current research to drive instruction. Tackle Monday data meetings were held monthly to plan enrichment and interventions. The continued, creative use of integrated technology into all subject area lessons afforded students with greater engagement and learning. By collaborating with teachers across all grades and curricular and fine arts areas, students have reaped the benefits of targeted, well-planned units of instruction. These collaborations were further highlighted during Read Across America Dr. Seuss Day, PBIS Celebration Cruise, Jump Rope for Heart, Science Fair, and Family Reading/Walking events. Teachers use common planning time to effectively research and plan instructional units.

Doby's Mill Elementary was recognized as a 2011-2013 South Carolina State School of Character, a 2012 National School of Character Nominee, a 2011-2013 Exemplary Writing School, 2010-2013 Red Carpet School, and the recipients of the Promising Practice for Beaming Beacon Award, the PBIS Red Ribbon Award, the SC Farm to School Grant, the Tool Box for Education Grant, and the Blue Cross Blue Shield sponsored Organwise Grant (only 2 in SC). We congratulate April Dixon for being our Reading Teacher of the Year and Andrea Derrick for being DME Teacher of the Year. Also, noteworthy, Helen Walker was recognized as being the 2011 Kershaw County District Teacher of the Year and one of five state finalists. Team GRIT won 3rd place in the Inspiration Award at the World Festival in St. Louis!

This year our incredible PTA continued their efforts to provide a variety of opportunities to promote parental involvement. Parent volunteerism is the cornerstone of our school's success and is further promoted by the targeted efforts of our supportive SIC. We met 18 of 19 NCLB objectives on our 2011 report card. Our compliance rating is 94.7%, and we earned an Excellent Absolute rating and Good Growth rating. Our challenges include maintaining our excellent report card ratings and achieving AYP status as the bar continues to rise. We will continue to address the challenges through our Title I interventions, differentiated instruction, use of technology, and by providing our staff with the training and materials needed to achieve success.

The mission of Doby's Mill Elementary School, in partnership with our community, is to provide a safe, nurturing, and innovative learning environment that empowers students with knowledge and skills to become self-disciplined, responsible, and productive citizens. A Title I school, our faculty, staff, and parents hold high standards for all students. Student safety and improving student success remain our top priorities. Our plans for the 2012-2013 school year are to work to integrate and implement the Common Core State Standards (CCSS). Our Math Model and Literacy Model will need to be revised to address the implementation of the new CCSS initiatives. Our highly motivated teachers and staff are dedicated and determined, and our students are bright and eager! Our fun, challenging, and enriching learning environment epitomizes our profound passion to educate!
