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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

The initials SHS for Socastee High School stand for Success, Honor, and Service. 2011-2012 was a very good year in all three areas. The Advanced Placement program added an additional course [AP Government] and almost 600 tests were administered, the most in school history. The International Baccalaureate Program administered almost 300 exams and previous scores were among the highest in South Carolina and the Southeast. Socastee earned its third straight "Excellent" Absolute rating on the State Report Card. A National Merit Finalist and National Achievement Finalist were recognized and received scholarships. ACT and SAT scores exceeded the National average for the third straight year. End of Course Test scores were the highest in school history and showed a growing mastery of the South Carolina standards. Ninth grade retentions fell to less than 5%, illustrating that our efforts at effective transitions for ninth graders were working. Socastee's Senior Class, numbering 359, was offered \$13.9 million in scholarships, accepting over \$7 million. The Air Force JROTC unit was named a Distinguished Unit for the 10th consecutive year. The Remote Operating Vehicle team advanced to the International Finals after winning the Southeast Regional competition and DECA once again qualified for National competition. In the Arts, "Legally Blonde" was the feature production, the Jazz Band was #1 in SC, and the Concert Band was recognized in the top 6 in SC. It was a proud moment when Socastee was named as one of South Carolina's top schools by U. S. News and World Report. Once again, a focus was placed on service learning. These efforts included three Blood Drives, the Polar Plunge for Special Olympics, hosting the District-wide Special Olympics for the 14th straight year, a Senior Citizen luncheon, History Club clean-ups and assisting Haitian Schools. The Socastee High School Faculty, staff, students, and community are both proud of their accomplishments and committed to continuous improvement in success, honor, and service.

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
