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**Report of Principal and School Improvement Council**

Blythewood High School was recognized as a finalist for the Palmetto's Finest Award for the 2011-2012 school year. The Bengals earned a finalist award with effective programs, innovative curriculum and a positive school climate supported by campus and community populations. The school achieved Palmetto Gold status for overall performance and for closing the Achievement Gap. The Army JROTC program is home to the Legion of Valor Bronze Cross award winner. This spring our Concert Choir had the opportunity to perform in Carnegie Hall as a selected performing group. Our drama and music departments collaborated for the presentation of a musical. Students and staff planned exchange programs with colleagues from Germany and Colombia. We sponsored a Columbia to Colombia program with great success where teachers and students had the opportunity to experience another community and school culture for a quarter of the year. Members of our culinary arts program traveled to Australia as part of an exchange program with support from local Rotarians. These on-going initiatives with global partners continue to allow educators and students to pursue meaningful conversations across cultural boundaries.

Blythewood High sports teams earned six region championships including titles for boys' bowling, girls' bowling, boys' golf, softball, baseball and girls' tennis. Individual and group programs and competitions for students recognized Blythewood students in the visual arts, criminal justice, drama, mock trial, band, orchestra, Virtual Enterprise, Future Business Leaders of America and Health Occupation Students of America. Blythewood High is proud of our South Carolina Health Occupations Teacher of the Year. Our extracurricular program provided opportunities for one hundred percent of our students to participate in school activities.

Blythewood High faculty, staff and students successfully completed a downsizing process for students and staff in preparation for the opening of another district high school in the fall. Students and staff supported the Blythewood community through participation in events such as the Blythewood Tournament of Bands, Breast Cancer Awareness activities and Special Olympics. Student-led service initiatives continued to support community agencies and activities including the Souper Bowl of Caring, Relay for Life, Children's Garden, God's Storehouse, Sister Care, SCDSS foster children, and other fundraising efforts.

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
