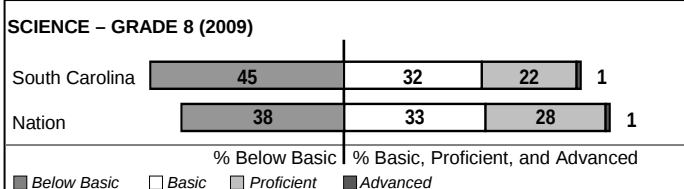
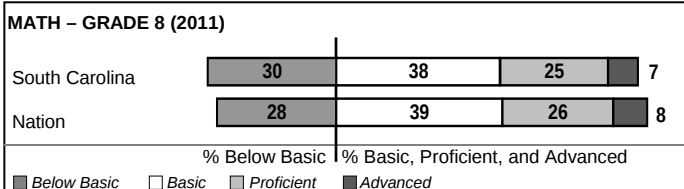
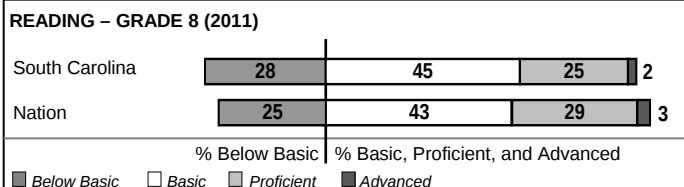
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

During the 2011 – 2012 school year, Myrtle Beach Middle School along with the rest of the Myrtle Beach area schools, began a journey to implement a leadership model that focuses on the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People. We would like to thank our business community for providing their support in our efforts to implement our leadership model and we applaud their involvement with our school.

In addition to implementing the leadership model, we are pleased to report the many successes and achievements of Myrtle Beach Middle School in the areas of academics, athletics, and extracurricular and community service activities. Literacy and writing in the content areas continues to be a major focus at Myrtle Beach Middle. In addition, we made a concentrated effort to raise the achievement level of all students in the area of English language arts.

Myrtle Beach Middle received awards and accolades in the following areas: 32 South Carolina Junior Scholars, 25 Explore Scholars, 1 Duke TIP Scholar, 102 students received Algebra I credit, 34 students received Geometry credit, 39 students received English I Honors credit, and 167 students received keyboarding credit. Over 30% of our 8th grade students took the PSAT. The fine arts program, with over 400 students participating in band, chorus, orchestra, and winter guard; received accolades and awards including superior and excellent ratings at various district, state, and regional competitions.

The Myrtle Beach Middle School athletic teams continued their long tradition of success with winning seasons for fall and winter B-team sports. Many students competed on JV and Varsity level sports, also.

At Myrtle Beach Middle, we try to provide a number of extra-curricular activities for our students and did so by offering several clubs for students to participate in after school. These included the Mock Trial and Robotics teams. Students placed in various local essay contests including first, second and third place in the Sertoma Club America Heritage Writing Contest, first place at the district level of the Lt. Governor's Essay contest, and first place in the Black History Writing contest. Two students tied for first place for best in show in the Horry County School's Technology Fair. We also had first and third place winners for the state level of National History Day Project. Our new student Lighthouse team, Student Council, the Ambassadors Group, and Ground Zero also offered opportunities for student leadership and involvement. Over 200 students qualified to join our Junior Beta Club at Myrtle Beach Middle School. Myrtle Beach Middle's faculty and staff provided support in helping these programs to be successful.

We continued our commitment to service learning. Students and staff donated over \$4300 to various causes: Make-A-Wish Foundation, Leukemia/Lymphoma Society, Relay for Life, Polar Plunge for Special Olympics, Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation, and over 1000 cans of food for area community kitchens.
