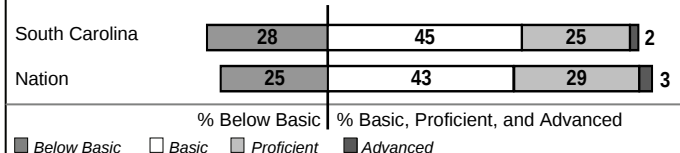
Our School Middle Schools with Students Like Ours Middle schools statewide



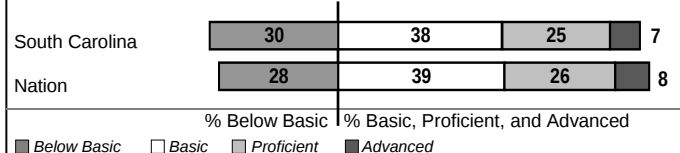

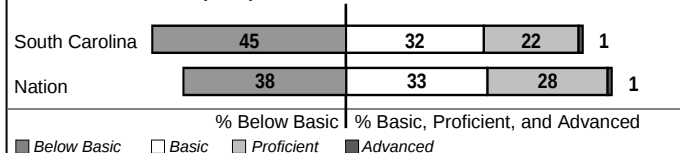
READING - GRADE 8 (2011)

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Camden Middle School continued to "Soar to Excellence" during the 2011-2012 academic year. The hard work and dedication of our teachers and students led to Camden Middle being recognized as a Palmetto Silver Award recipient for academic achievement. We were also proud to have Ms. Valerie Willis recognized as the State and Southeast Region Earth Science Teacher of the Year.

Our students experienced great success in and out of the classroom this year. Seventeen Camden Middle School students were selected as South Carolina Junior Scholars. The Camden Middle School Science Department took our school to new heights competed in the Clemson-NASA Asteroid Mission Project for Middle Schools. Fourteen Camden Middle School students took top awards at the competition and 32 received an Honorable Mention! Several students were awarded the State Superintendent's Writing Award while CMS students won various state and local poetry and art awards. Camden Middle School band students earned an "excellent" rating at State Concert & Jazz Band Festivals and 3 "excellent" and 16 "superior" ratings at the State Solo and Ensemble Festival.

We continued to excel in sports with all of our teams experiencing winning seasons. Our boys' basketball team was undefeated for the third consecutive season. We were also proud of our new Fellowship of Christian Athletes initiative that totaled 132 participants for the year.

A very special thank you to all of our students, parents, teachers, counselors, administrators, and support staff who work together to make Camden Middle School a wonderful place for adolescents to learn and grow in a positive and nurturing environment.
