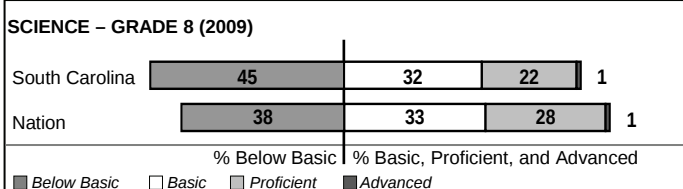
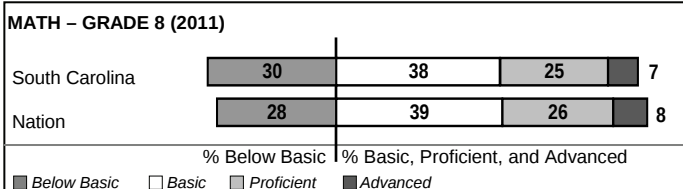
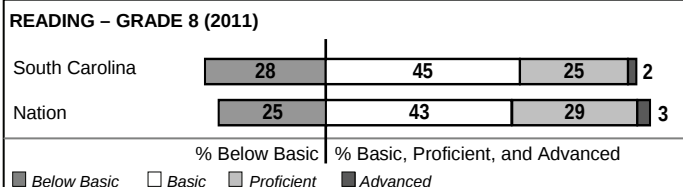
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Buford Middle School's theme for the 2011-2012 school year was "Learning Through The Decades". Each grade level and team picked a decade to study. Students were exposed to the news, media stars, and music from that decade. Students then presented artwork, music, and dances that portrayed the decade that they were studying.

We completed 2 school wide reads this year. First semester we read The Bystander. This book was about bullying in the middle school and was an excellent way to begin the new year. Second semester we read The Hunger Games and celebrated by taking the entire school to see the movie. Afterwards each grade level wrote about the differences between the print and media version.

Each grade level sponsors a family night each year. Our 8th grade researched different careers and then presented a Career Fair for the community. Our 7th grade studied the Holocaust and then presented a program, The Holocaust in Verse. The 6th grade presented A Day in Medieval Times. This program was complete with a magician, story teller, swords, catapults, and costumes. Each of these events was well sponsored by our parents and community.

We are beginning our 4th year of our Summer Reading Program. Students receive a book prior to the end of school and then can come to our library during the summer and take AR tests and earn field trip points. We want our students to become super readers.

Buford Middle School works very hard to make our students aware of the need of our communities and world. We participated in Relay For Life, March of Dimes Mathathon, and food drives for Hope of Lancaster. We also raised money for medical needs in our community.

We continued to garner many awards. Our band won awards at festivals and contests. We had Duke Tip Scholars and National Junior Scholars. Our chorus presented to a sold out audience. Many of our teachers were recognized as Celebrate Great Teaching nominees. Our teachers wrote and received 7 grants that included everything from science supplies to gym equipment. Our school was also fortunate to receive from the District an I-Pad lab to begin work with next year. We have been named a NetScope school and a Making Middle Grades Work school.

We appreciate the support that our community and parents provide to us. Working together we can achieve great goals.
