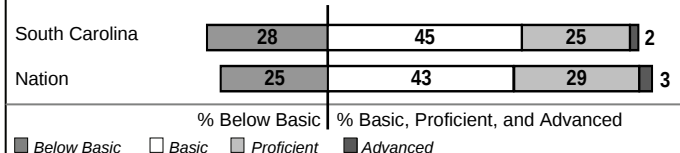
Our School Middle Schools with Students Like Ours Middle schools statewide



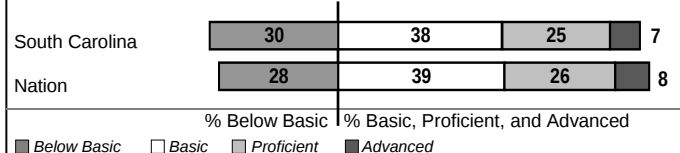

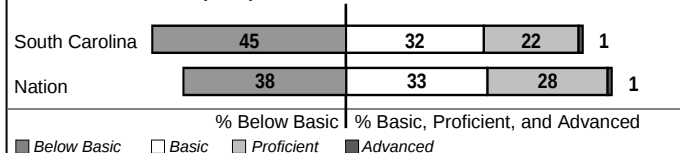
READING - GRADE 8 (2011)
