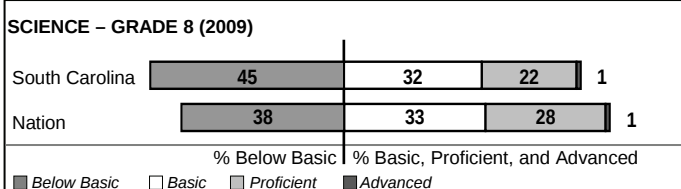
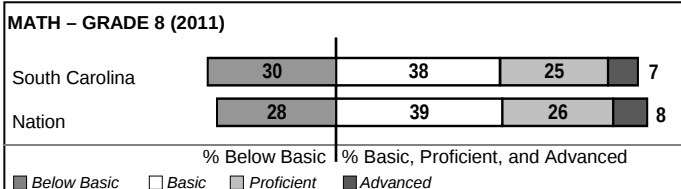
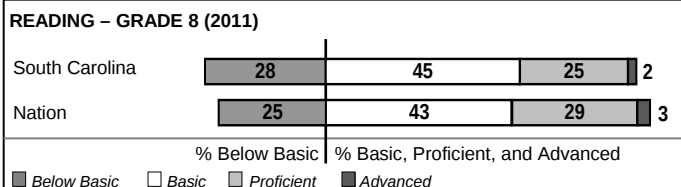
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Pendergrass Fairwold School serves medically fragile and severely mentally and physically disabled students from ages 3-21 who require a structured educational environment which will help them maximize physical mobility, self-help skills, life skills, and consequently, facilitate their adjustment to community living. We also provide services for students ages 18 to 21 who require significant supportive programming to transition from school to work or from school to independent living. All students receive educational and related services according to their Individual Education Plan (IEP) and are monitored for progress according to the guidelines of their IEP.

In our continued effort to improve the quality of instruction, teachers have focused on renewing themselves as professionals and as a school. In keeping with this goal, all certified staff participated in a monthly Monday Book Café. Our professional conversations are focused on the book "The Inspired Teacher." Also as part of our renewal this school term, committees were reorganized. Committees mirrored areas that we are working on for school renewal as well as responsibilities for initiatives that we are involved in on a yearly basis.

Our students have worked hard and were engaged in many activities since the beginning of the school year. One of our focuses this year has been on literacy. Each class had a designated time of the day when they were immersed in literacy activities. Each month we focused on a different genre in literacy. The Bear's General Store opened this Spring. As a reward for students' achievements, they received "Bear Bucks" that are used to purchase items from the store. The goal of the store is to expose students to applicable life skills in a simulated setting.

We will continue to implement and monitor the goals of our school improvement plan as we continue to make our teaching strategies and outcomes more transparent to our parents and shareholders.
