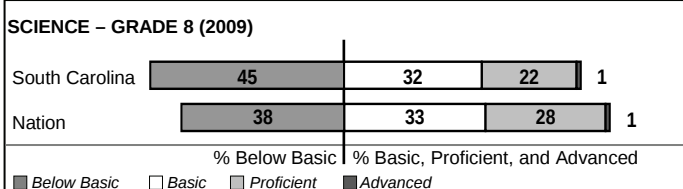
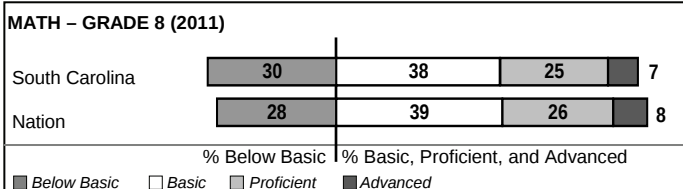
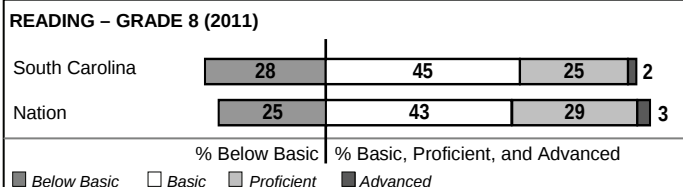
PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

"Expect Their Best" was the motto for Cowpens Middle School in 2011-2012. We were excited to experience another year of continued academic growth and achievement. Focusing on student success as our primary goal, the faculty, staff, and administration made every effort to provide assistance to all students to make college enrollment a reality.

Providing students with Enrichment and Red Raider Reading classes daily were two avenues to academic success. Students were also given the opportunity to attend extended day classes twice a week. Teachers worked on presenting students with assessments which were rigorous and standards-based. Formative and summative assessment design was a major focus for faculty as they continued to work on the middle level curriculum.

Joining hundreds of other schools worldwide, CMS implemented the Olweus Bullying Prevention Program. Teachers successfully incorporated this international, researched program into our character education program. Through weekly class meetings and HERO recognition, CMS is much closer to being 'Bully Free.'

CMS students continue to show excellence in all areas. Nine 8th grade students were honored as Junior Scholars, one 7th grade student was recognized as Duke Tip Scholar; and two of our 8th grade students were accepted to the Scholar's Academy for the 2012-13 school year. Our drama and music atlas students presented "Aladdin" in the District Three Community Auditorium.

The Veteran's Day program, student registration presentation, and school website received communications awards from the South Carolina Chapter of the National School Public Relations Association. Other areas that deserve special recognition were the generosity and caring of our student body. Students continued to raise money for Relay for Life, provide student care packages, and cleaned up a local cemetery.

The middle school years are full of excitement and change, with this year being no exception. As we continue to "Expect Their Best," Cowpens Middle School embraces "A Revolutionary Past" and looks forward to "An Extraordinary Future."
