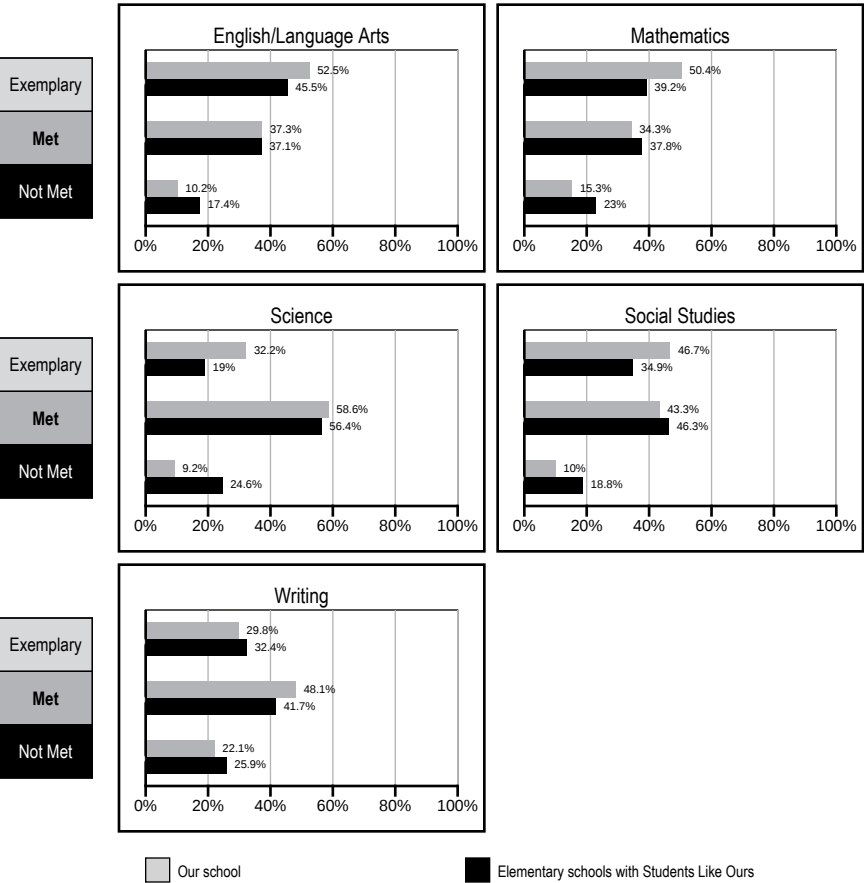

Palmetto Elementary and Preschool continues to SOAR! Our mission is Promoting Curiosity, Educating Minds, and Securing Futures! This mission consistently encourages our faculty and staff to maintain high standards for all students throughout the years. Improving student success is our number one goal. Palmetto Elementary is a Title I school with the most diverse student body in Anderson School District One. A contributing factor is that our school continues to have a very transient student body. The faculty and staff of Palmetto Elementary continuously do a great job of welcoming new students and returning students in order to quickly determine their needs for learning and to provide enrichment opportunities to promote a life-long love of learning.

Our students and staff continued an emphasis on reading. Full implementation of guided reading is proving to be successful using MAP results and the levels of growth as measured by Fountas and Pinnell. We have a strong RTI (Response to Intervention) team that helps to ensure all students receive the intervention and challenges needed to promote a love for reading.

Palmetto Elementary students and families enjoyed numerous opportunities for fun while supporting our school at the same time. Our PTO does an amazing job providing an activity each month. The activities included open house, skating nights, movie nights, Fall Carnival, Spring Fling, Cookies with Santa, and clean-up days. Each event was very well supported and appreciated by our students, parents, and faculty. The funds collected this year through our fundraisers and Box Tops for Education have been used for playground equipment and a perimeter fence. Their volunteer and fundraising efforts are tireless and a wonderful model for our students!

Palmetto Elementary and Preschool has had many accomplishments including: 2012 Excellent for Absolute Rating and Excellent for Growth Rating , provided PASS night for parents, Family Reading night each week, conferences were held with 100% of all parents; Clemson University provided student tutors, the after-school program tutored and provided enrichment for 63 students, students and staff participate in the community recycling program, Pennies for Patients for the Leukemia Society of America, School-wide Pony Express mail system, Beta Club, Student Council, Drama Club, Palmetto Singers, Art Club, safety patrols, Recorder Choir, and numerous volunteers spent countless hours serving our school.

ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
