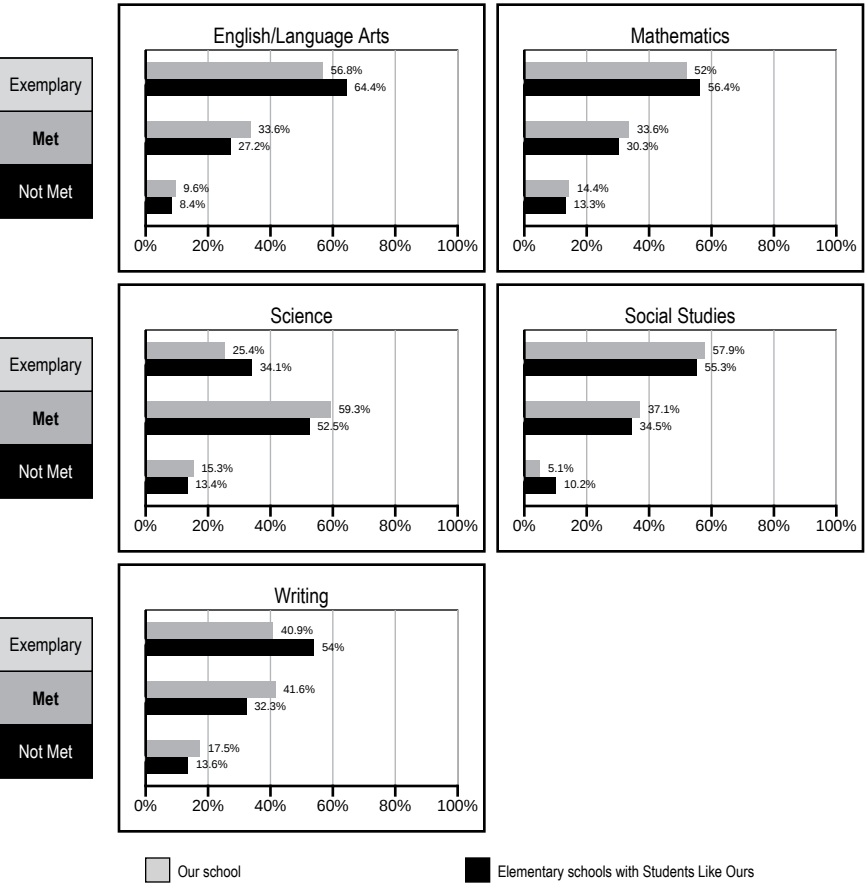

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Bookman Road Elementary School (BRES) is a beacon of high academic achievement and vision. The school staff's knowledge of brain research, environmental learning, and differentiated instruction guide the BRES instructional blueprint. All instruction and instructional activities are rigorous, project-based and engaging, and aligned with the South Carolina Curriculum Standards and immersion into Common Core State Standards.

The BRES learning community focuses acutely on academic pursuit, enrichment and the establishment of a positive school culture. BRES students are challenged daily through a developmentally appropriate academic curriculum. The school culture promotes the tenants of nineteen LIFESKILLS and five Lifelong Guidelines of Personal Best, Trustworthiness, Truthfulness, Active Listening and No Putdowns. Learning at BRES is customized to address students' varying learning styles, needs or special accommodations.

Students at Bookman Road are assessed using a variety of formal and informal, prescriptive and achievement tools (i.e., State Assessments, Fitness Gram, Accelerated Reader, Measures of Academic Progress, DIBELS, Developmental Reading Assessment, etc.). Students are provided differentiated support and encouragement to excel regardless of their ability levels.

To address students' varying areas of interest in enrichment, BRES sponsors numerous clubs and after-school programs (i.e., Art Club, Sports & Fitness, Chorus, Yearbook, Golf, Soccer, Gymnastics, Dance, Airwaves Crew, Project Unify, Girls on the Run, and World Language), and specialized programs including Remediation/Tutoring, Academic Team, and ALERT (Gifted & Talented).

The military population at BRES has grown throughout recent years, and to help support military families, the school has acquired a Department of Defense Grant for 2012-2015. The school also offers a military child support group, a Beacon Battle Buddies after-school program, and several military recognition events, including an annual Military Breakfast. The BRES community emphasizes the importance of supporting our military families for the service and sacrifices that they make for our country.

BRES is a past recipient of the Dick and Tunky Riley School Improvement Council Award (2007-2008), Recipient of (9) Palmetto Gold and (2) Silver Award, Red Carpet School (2002, 2006, 2010), South Carolina Gold Volunteer Award (2006-07), and Closing the Achievement Gap Award (2002-2010).

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
