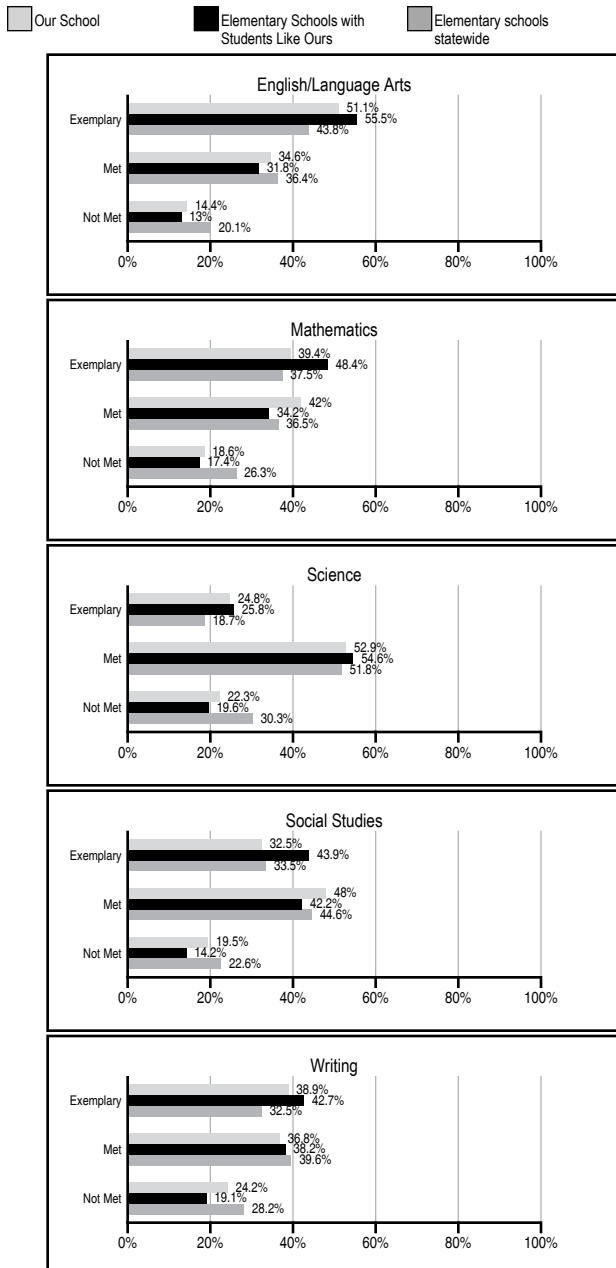

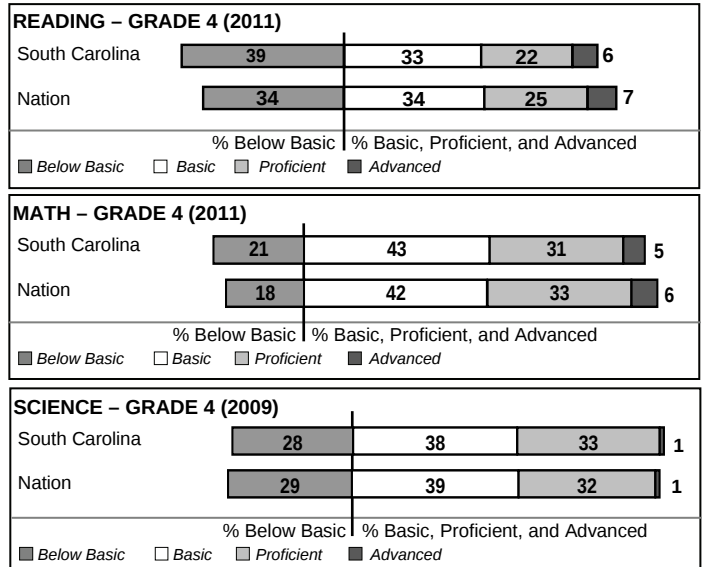

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Hunt Meadows Elementary School completed a busy and successful school year. Our Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) and our School Improvement Council (SIC) continue to play a vital role in our school's success. We continue to strive for excellence in academics, character education, and service learning. Our school, in concert with our extremely active PTO, SIC, Student Council, and National Elementary Honor Society organized and implemented several altruistic projects for the school and community: recycling, no idle campaign, Angel Tree, Green House Project, Foothills Alliance (donation of stuffed animals for abused children), Linus Project, Relay for Life, care packages to soldiers overseas, and providing blankets for the homeless in our area. Our PTO conducted a successful fund raising event that enabled us to purchase rubber mulch for our playground.
