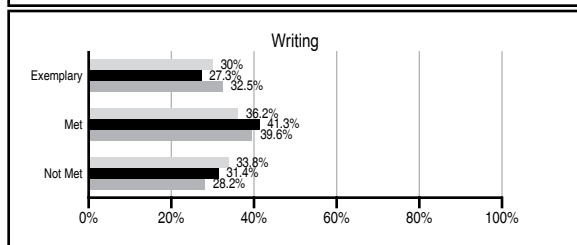

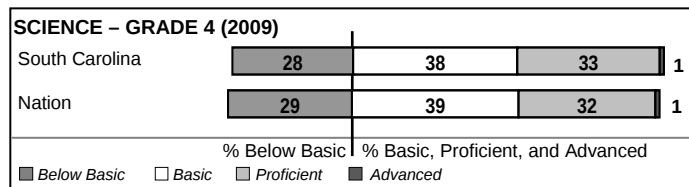
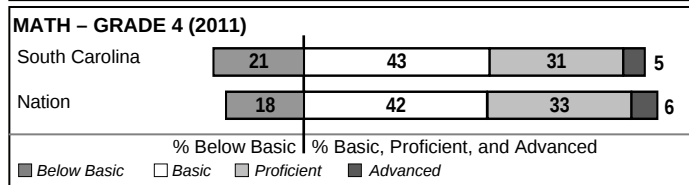
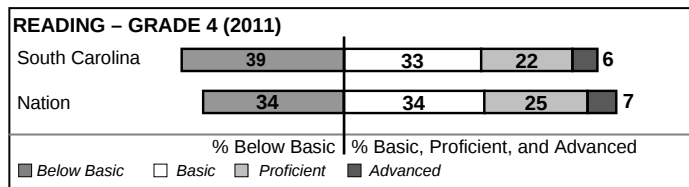
PASS PERFORMANCE
