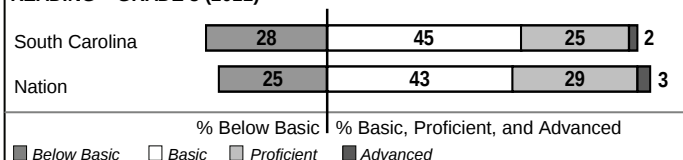

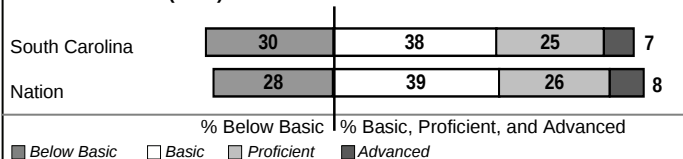

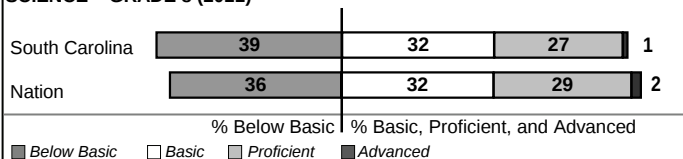
READING - GRADE 8 (2011)

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Serving more than 1300 students, Chapin High School has a proud tradition of excellence in academics, athletics, and the arts. We are honored to be recognized by U. S. News and World Report, The Washington Post and Newsweek Magazine as one of America's Best High Schools. We were awarded the prestigious Palmetto Gold Award for academic excellence. Chapin High's SAT scores exceeded national and state averages. Our four-year graduation rate of 92.7% and five-year graduation rate of 94.5% are among the highest in South Carolina. Our End-of-Course passage rate of 89.2% is the highest in the Midlands. The key to this success is the strong partnership between the school and our community.

The faculty and staff believe that when students are meaningfully involved with the school they will be successful. As a result of Chapin's commitment to reaching each student, we currently sponsor 42 clubs and organizations and 45 athletic sports which provide multiple opportunities for all of our students to be successful. The Department of the Navy named Chapin High School's NJROTC as State Champions.

Chapin provided multiple opportunities for students in the Performing Arts, which include chorus, orchestra, visual arts, band, dance and drama. Our chorus and band programs are literally the "Pride of the Midlands" because of their numerous Superior ratings. This year our Marching Band was named AAA State Champions, winning each competition of the season. Eleven students were selected to the All-State Chorus, and one student was selected to the All-State Orchestra.

With more than 65 percent of the student body participating in one or more sports, the South Carolina High School League has ranked our school 6th in AAA classification for the Athletic Directors Cup. The Chapin High School athletic department continued in its excellence by being rated one of the best in the Midlands. Our cheerleaders have won nine State Championships, and the men's tennis team was state runner-up in their fourth consecutive State Championship appearance.

Our faculty and staff are committed to helping each student reach his/her potential. To promote the ideals of scholarships and leadership, Chapin High offers an Academic Leadership Academy, in which students take Advanced Placement classes while developing leadership skills that prepare them to make an impact in the 21st Century. Chapin High administered more than 869 Advanced Placement exams, and our goal is to increase the number of students enrolled in Advanced Placement courses of study.

Chapin High also offers the SAIL (Success Acquired in Learning) program to provide assistance for all "at-risk" students. In the 2012-13 school year, our students truly exemplified our Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) motto, "We aRe Chapin." As a result, we received "Ribbon Status" for our implementation of a program that expects students to be Ready to learn, Respectful to others, and Responsible. Our Student Government helped to raise thousands of dollars for community service projects. We are proud of our students and their successes.
