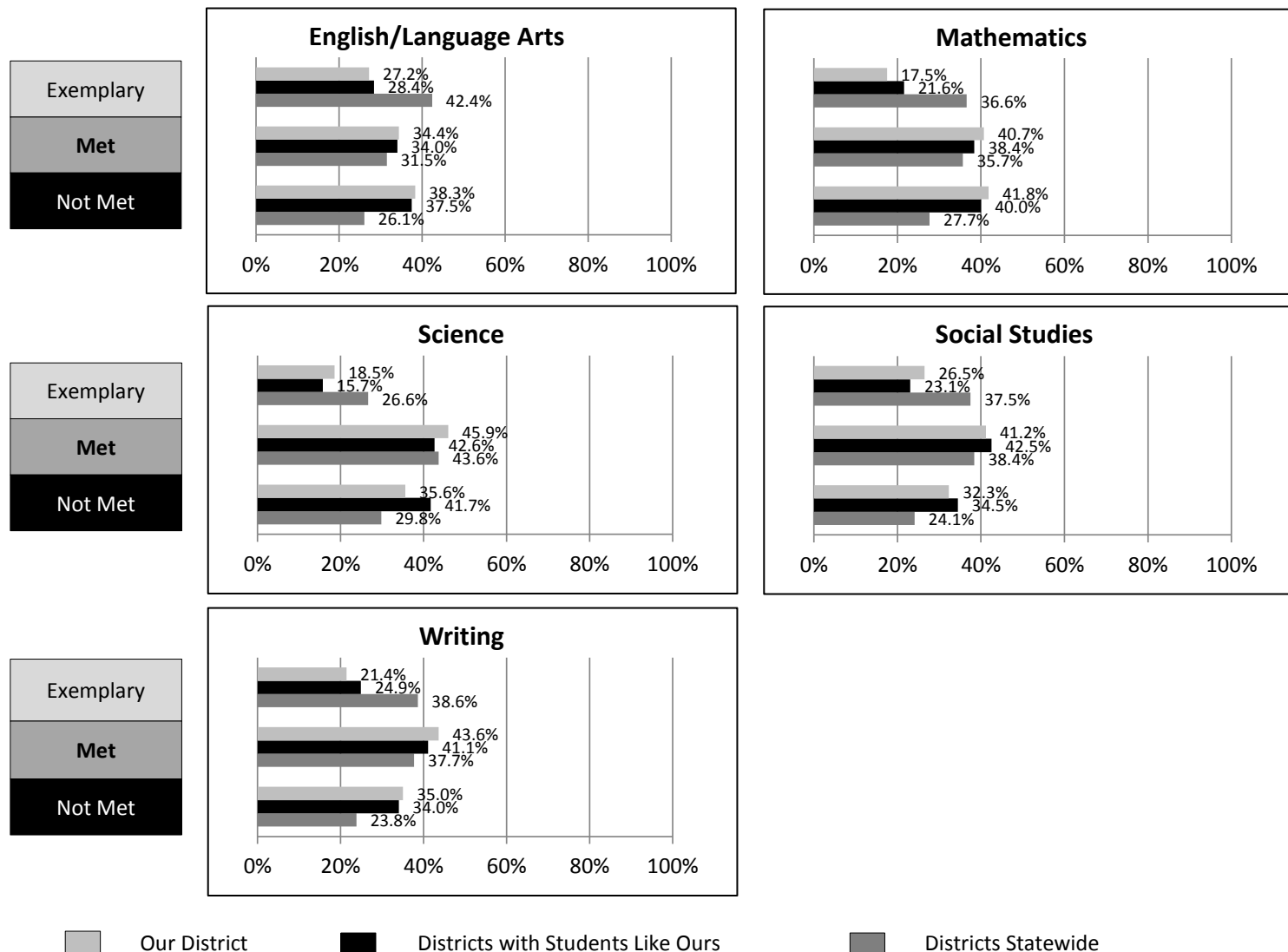

District Superintendent's Report

Colleton County School District successfully ended the school year despite difficult challenges and changes. Staff maintained focus and demonstrated dedication to our mission to ensure that all students meet or exceed state standards. The district received Advanc-Ed Accreditation in 2013 and began implementing the recommended processes: to review/update school board policies, to analyze instructional practices, and to analyze current technology needs and framework to ensure student use. CCSD partnered with Transform SC, a program providing options to transform schools. The district joined FMU's Center of Excellence to participate in relevant staff development.

Colleton County High School's (CCHS) New Tech Entrepreneurial Academy was implemented this year. Cougar New Tech (CNT) offers students technology to complete group projects as they would in a professional work environment. Paired facilitators teach integrated courses. Students create standards-based projects. All CNT students have a 1:1 student to technology ratio; students log community service hrs; and parent volunteer time is logged. Math scores improved, discipline improved, and failures diminished. CCHS hosted the State Student Council Convention in March. Students from across SC participated in leadership activities. The Academic Team, NJROTC, Band of Blue, Chorus, and girls' basketball all were award winning.

Colleton County Middle (CCMS), a SC Palmetto Silver Award winner, focused attention on STEM activities. CCMS was the first public school in SC to be selected to participate in the Student Space Flight Experiments Program. Funded by local partners, students conducted research to be tested on the International Space Station in fall of 2014. CCMS also received a 3-year grant from Boeing and a 3-year grant from Clemson Extension that promote STEM. Industrial technology invited the Sea Perch Underwater Robotics and Vex Robotics Team to CCMS, and students designed underwater and land use robots. CCMS partnered with the Tuskegee Airmen, Inc., Hiram E. Mann Chapter, and hosted the Middle School Minds Take Flight aviation camp this summer to promote student interest in careers in aviation, technology, and aerospace. Math and science teachers participated in the STEM Summer Institute. Project CARE, an afterschool/extended school program, was implemented for at-risk students.

Elementary schools are making gains. Bells and Hendersonville completed their 2nd yr in SC TAP. Several schools participated in community service projects, such as Pennies for Patients and food drives. Elementary schools perform CPAA and MAP data analysis to inform instruction. CCSD implemented the South Carolina Child Development Education Pilot Program (CDEPP) to focus on the developmental needs of our youngest learners. Staff development was provided weekly in writing, common core, and engaging students. Each elementary has an instructional facilitator to provide teachers support. Instructional interventionists at each school provide additional support to students.

Ms. Alisa Lemon, 5th grade teacher at Cottageville, was named the Teacher of the Year; and Ms. Caitlin O'Donnell, a special education teacher at Colleton County Middle, was named the Rookie Teacher of the Year.

This year's accomplishments can be attributed to student efforts, quality teachers, supportive parents, and community involvement. We will carry these accomplishments forward as we seek opportunities for continuous improvement.

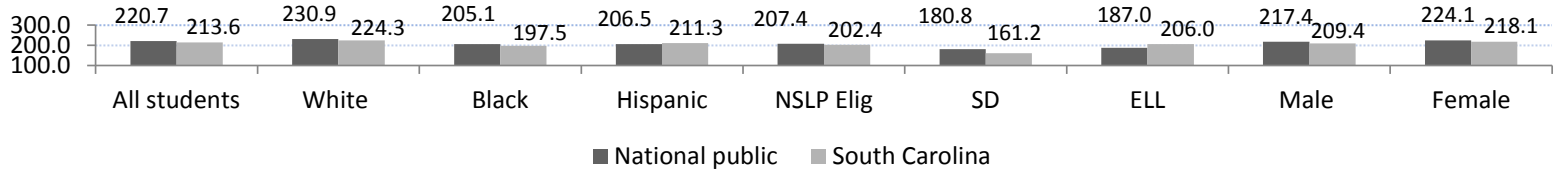

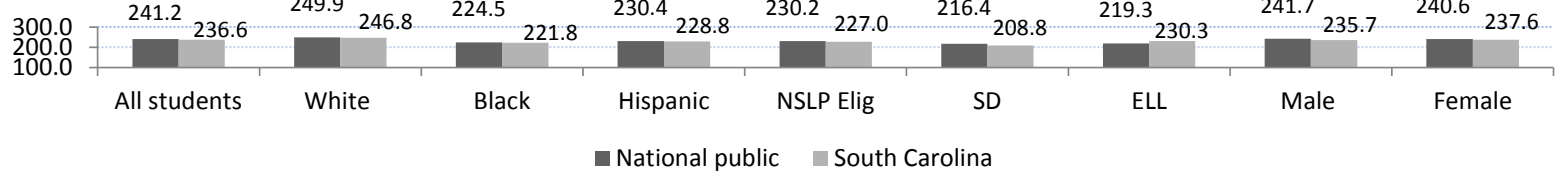

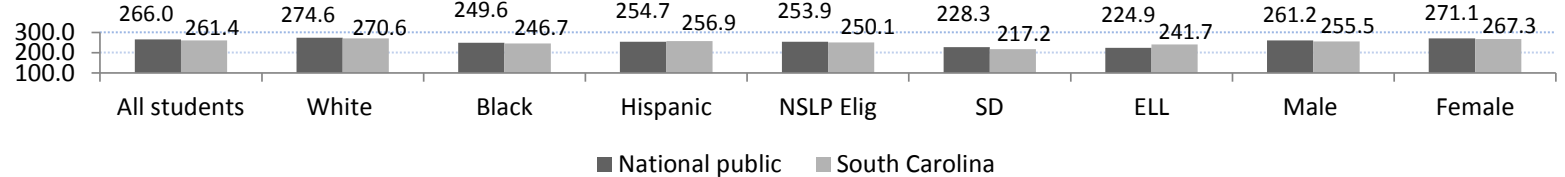
Reading - Grade 4 (2013)



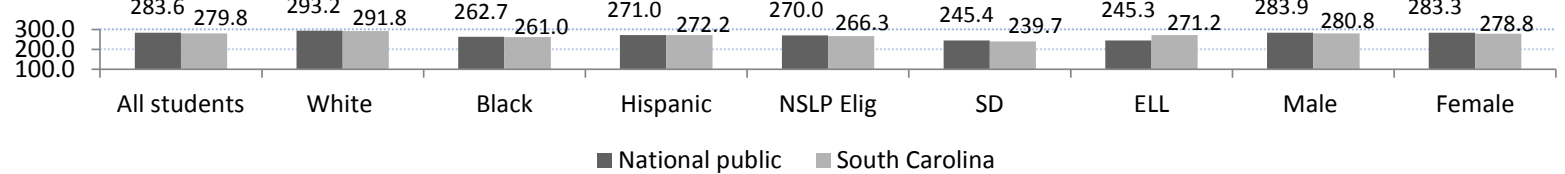
Mathematics - Grade 4 (2013)
