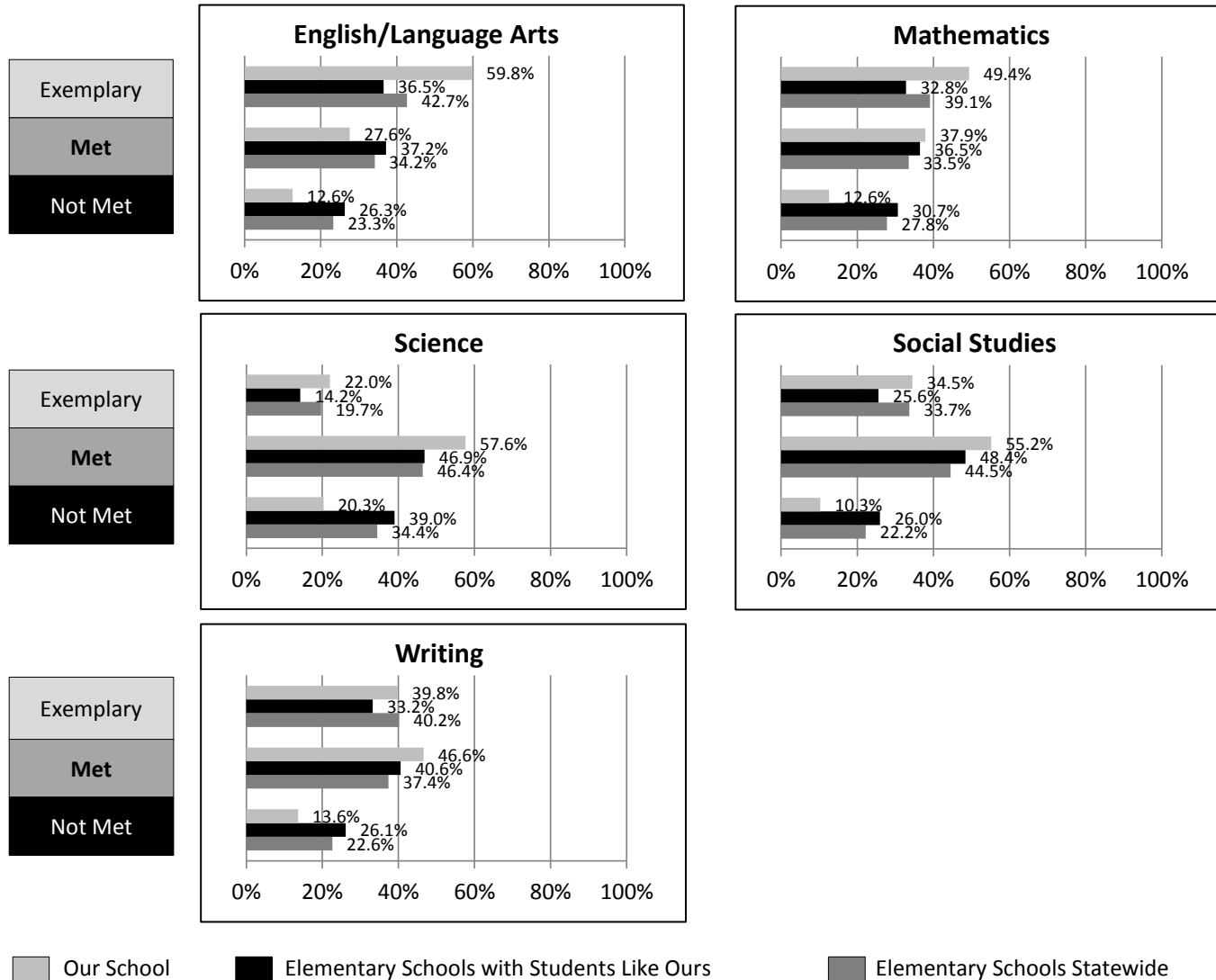

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Baron DeKalb Elementary (BDK) is committed to providing a rigorous and challenging academic foundation that promotes student success, as evidenced by the school's continuous recognition for student achievement. BDK earned an "A" on the ESEA/Federal Accountability System Report Card, and the school was recognized for excellent results in closing the achievement gap for historically underperforming students. Our school performance exceeded the standards for progress toward the 2020 SC Performance Vision. ¶

Stakeholders worked together to sponsor the school's first "Lights On Afterschool" event, which was a huge success for the school and the community. Camden Mayor Tony Scully proclaimed October 17, 2013 as "Lights On Afterschool Day." The afterschool program was recognized for providing significant leadership in the area of community involvement in the education and well-being of our youth. ¶

Due to the efforts of staff, parents, and community members, BDK received a \$30,000 grant from the 21st Century Community Learning program to provide a summer camp for 1st-4th grade students. Baron DeKalb Elementary was also the recipient of a \$5000 Target Grant for the "Bundles of Books for BDK" program. Funds were used to purchase non-fiction books for the school library, which helped to improve the school library selection rating. ¶

The partnership between home, school and community is vital to the success of our school. The Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) and the School Improvement Council (SIC) are dedicated to supporting the efforts of the staff and students at BDK. Attendance at events such as, PTO meetings, school performances, Songs of the Season, and the annual talent show reflects the outstanding commitment of the staff, students, parents, and community to this great school. ¶

BDK is a past recipient of the Dick and Tunky Riley School Improvement Council Award (2012), SIC Honor Roll School (2011 & 2012), Red Carpet School Award (2007 & 2010), Exemplary Writing Program Award (2011-2014), and Closing the Achievement Gap Award (2008, 2010, 2013 & 2014). ¶

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the Federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
