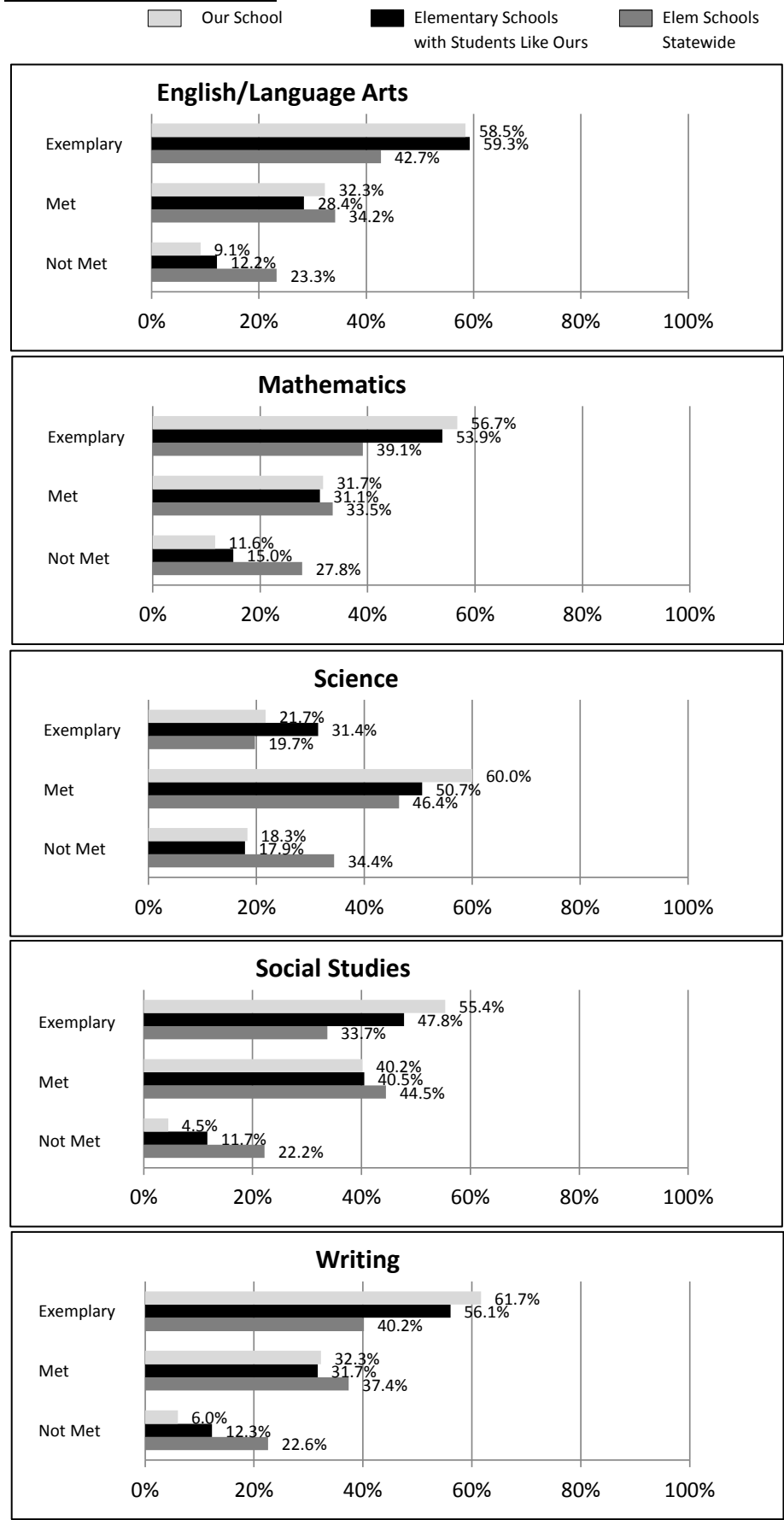

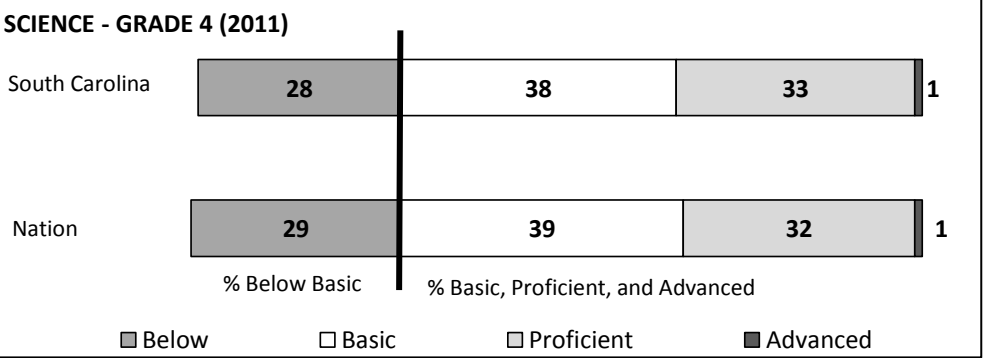

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Marrington Elementary is located at Joint Base Charleston and serves the military community in Berkeley County. Marrington offers Pre-Kindergarten through 5th grade children varied opportunities to meet our high academic standards, as well as character building and physical activity. Programs offered include: Marrington Singers, “Good Morning, Marrington” news show, parenting workshops, “Virtue of the Month” character education program, Mother/Daughter Book Club, Father/Son “Guys Read” Program, CUBS Code, monthly mini career fairs, business and military affiliation partnerships, Jump Rope for Heart, and various PTO sponsored family activities. Marrington Elementary has an active volunteer program and PTO membership. Our PTO sponsors grade level performances throughout the year. The PTO and School Improvement Council (SIC) meet monthly to assist and guide efforts to continuously improve support to students and the community.

The instructional program at MNE is enhanced through small group instruction for reading and math, outdoor learning labs and a leadership program. Marrington has two computer labs, class sets of mobile devices and interactive touch boards in all core classrooms. Throughout the year, our media specialist provides engaging and motivating promotions to encourage the love of reading within the students. Additionally, MNE participates in Berkeley County Spelling and Multiplication Bees, All-County Chorus, local visual art exhibitions, and STEP Art programs. Special Education services are also provided to students with disabilities.

MNE has been recognized by the SC Education Oversight Committee for outstanding student performance results at the Gold and Silver levels on the state assessment for ten consecutive years. Marrington’s highly qualified staff contains one doctorate degree, fourteen Master’s degrees, and eleven National Board Certified teachers working with our students daily.

The staff at MNE fosters positive home-school communication through the use of webpages, ConnectEd messaging system, social media, Weekly Wednesday Newsletters, positive postcards and phone calls, monthly school calendar of events, and the Marrington Marquee.

The collaborative effort of the administration, faculty, staff, PTO, SIC, parents, and the community assures that we will challenge and empower our students to be successful in a highly competitive world. The Marrington Elementary community is continues to “Boost Learners and Build Leaders” and make each day a success for our students.
