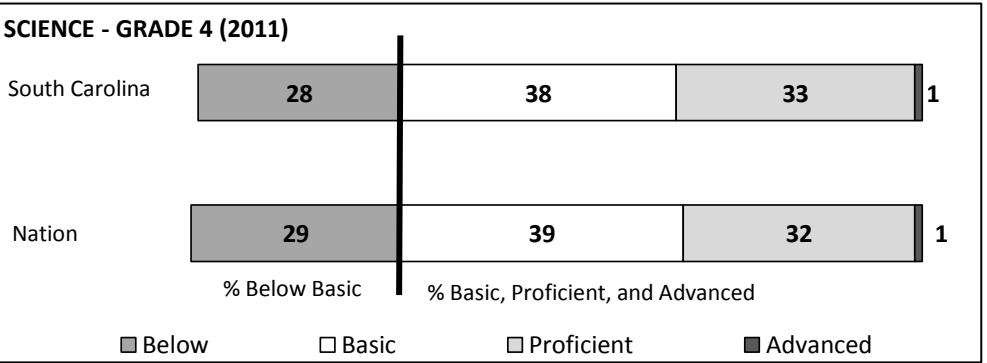

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Cane Bay Elementary School is currently home to a population of approximately 900 students in pre-kindergarten through fourth grade and is continuously growing. Cane Bay Elementary is fortunate to have an outstanding PTA, active volunteers, and community support that provide a shared responsibility and shared accountability for all aspects of our school. The stakeholders of our school have worked hard to ensure that students of Cane Bay receive high-quality and highly rigorous instruction on the newly implemented Common Core State Standards. We are committed to the district mission to provide students with dynamic instruction and ignite in all students a passion for life-long learning. The expertise of the teachers and instructional staff at Cane Bay has provided students with the support necessary for an exceptional implementation of this curriculum and they have grasped this change with enthusiasm and excitement. All teachers participate in Professional Learning Communities as a way to increase their content knowledge and improve professionally. Over sixty percent of our teachers have earned a Masters degree or higher and seven teachers are Nationally Board Certified. The Cane Bay Elementary staff continues to increase their professional knowledge through staff development and course work.

The school earned the Palmetto Gold Award in both general student performance and closing the achievement gap in 2013. This follows three years of earning Palmetto Silver or Gold in these categories. The school continues to implement a structured Mutli-Tier System of Support and Enrichment program that provides at-risk students with remedial instruction and accelerates the skills of advanced students. In addition to school-wide and individual student academic successes, students are awarded for their exceptional behavior through the school’s Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) program. Students also participate in community programs that enhance development and promote citizenship. These programs include Kiwanis “Terrific Kids” character education and the Kids Who Care Project Grant. Second and third grade students participated in the Roscoe Reader program that provided students with free books as an incentive for reading throughout the school year.

At Cane Bay Elementary School the needs of all children and their learning come first. The school will continue to strive to meet the demands of the twenty-first century and Berkeley County School District’s vision to challenge and empower our students to be successful in a highly competitive world.
