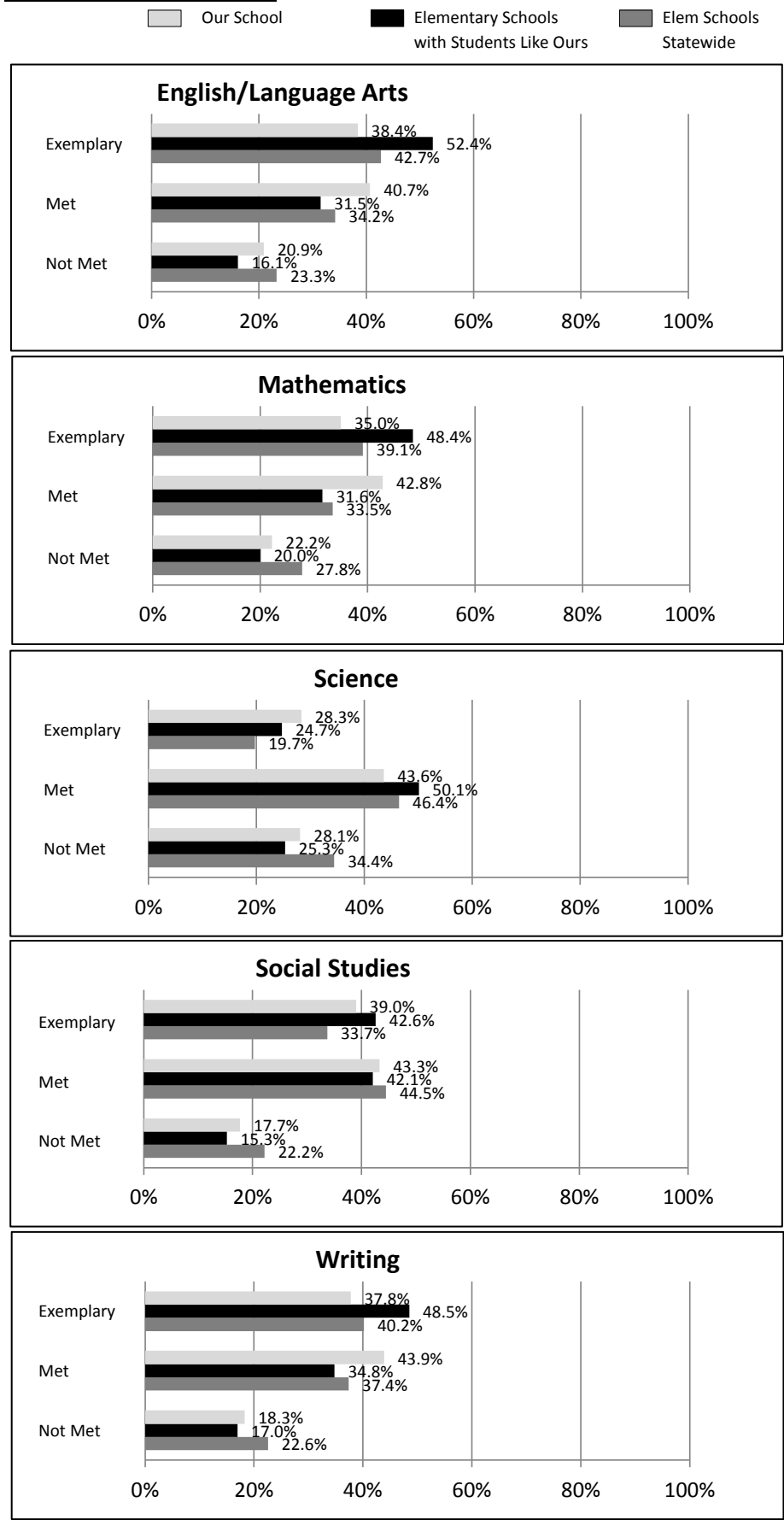

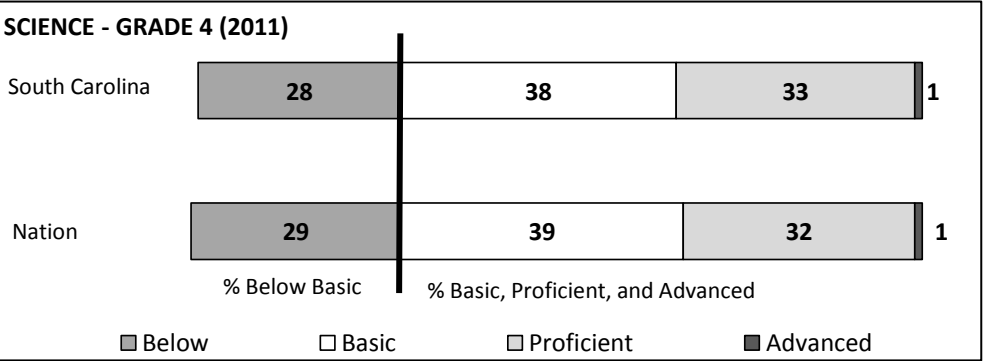

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

John W. Moore Intermediate School celebrated our grand opening in the fall of 2013. Our first year in our new building has been filled with excitement and wonderful experiences for the students, parents, staff and community. We have a new school colors (maroon and gold) and a new mascot, the Lions. Our mission is to Educate! Prepare! Inspire! We are continuing to maintain our high expectations and working diligently to accomplish our school-wide goals. One goal this year was to increase academic achievement in all areas. An academic program before school (Smart Start) and afterschool were utilized to help meet the individual needs of our students. Students have access to four computer labs with a certified teacher and a technology coach to assist with technology integration in all content areas. Teachers have been receiving ongoing professional development with the implementation of Common Core State Standards. Due to the commitment and dedication of our excellent teachers, students are provided the opportunity to enhance their academics and leadership potential by participating in 18 extracurricular clubs/competitions. Our Robotics team won a first place award at the regional and state competitions. We are also proud that we received a “B” on the 2013 School Report Card and a “Good” Absolute Rating. A second goal was to increase parental involvement in our school. In addition to inviting parents to volunteer and serve on our active APT and SIC, several Title I parent workshops and special family events were held to encourage family participation. Events included; Dads in the Dugout, Muffins for Mom, Talent Show, Math Carnival, Family Fun Night, Expo/Techno Night, and many others. Moore received an NNPS grant from the Center of Excellence for our Dads in the Dugout event. We also were recognized by the Character Education Partnership as a 2014 Promising Practice National and International Award Winner. The focus of our third goal was to increase principles of character education and citizenship in our students. This was the first year that Moore began the implementation of Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports. We developed school-wide behavioral expectations for our students and acknowledged positive behavior through programs such as; student of the month, bus of the month, character coupons, academic awards, pep rallies, dances, and other invitations to student events. We integrated the Core Essentials Character Education Program throughout the school and taught the “Steps to Respect” anti-bullying curriculum. The S.A.V.E. club was established to educate students on the need to decrease the potential for violence in our schools and community. Students participated in numerous service learning projects such as Jump Rope for Heart, Pasta for Pennies, several food drives and more.
