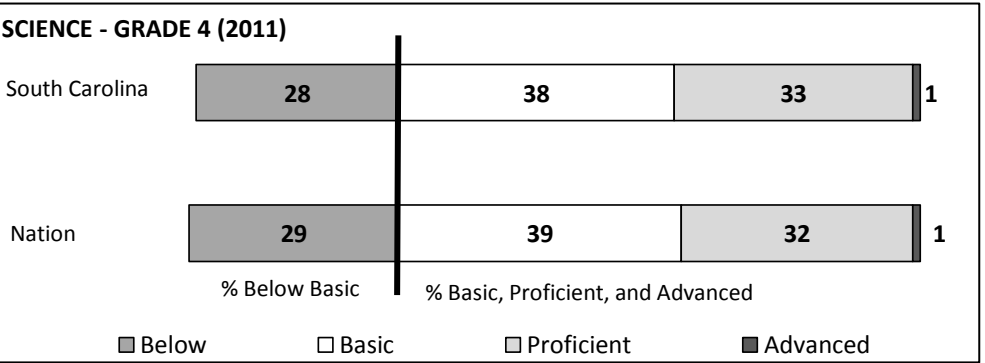

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The purpose of Greenwood Elementary School (GES) is to help students reach their greatest potential. The faculty and staff, parents, and community remain steadfast in their commitment to support and encourage students in setting and achieving goals – academic and extracurricular.

Accredited by the South Carolina Department of Education and AdvancEd, Greenwood is a five time recipient of the Palmetto Gold and Silver Award for Achievement based on levels of general academic performance.

There are many exceptional features that make Greenwood a great place to learn! Our Literacy Lab and Reading Recovery provide K-2 students with a sound foundation in reading. In addition, students in grades 1-6 participate in the Reading Renaissance program that promotes the joy of reading to learn and for pleasure. Students read and acquire points to reach grade level goals to participate in the Principal’s Road Trip and Annual Picnic.

GES offers two full-time computer labs, a mobile wireless laptop lab, three mobile iPad carts, SCETV Video streaming programming, interactive whiteboards in every classroom, and student response systems which are integrated across the curriculum for differentiated instruction. Our APT outfitted our cafeteria with a new projector and screen which was much needed!

Students have many opportunities to participate in extra-curricular activities at Greenwood such as the Student Council, BETA Club, Safety Patrols, WGES Morning Show, Chorus, Bells, Band, Strings, Cheer and Pep Squads, Good News Club, Girl Scouts, Speed Cup Stacking Club and Monthly Skate Nights.

GES also provides our students with the opportunity to develop social skills and responsibility as well as individual talents by participating in school wide giving campaigns. This year our students raised \$12,667 for Jump Rope for Heart. Our students participated in Wreaths across America, Fall Food Drive and our Hat and Mitten Giving Tree.

We believe the combined efforts of our students, parents, community, and faculty and staff is needed to educate and prepare our students for the wins and challenges of tomorrow. Our partnerships with the National Network of Partnership Schools, our Association of Parents and Teachers, our Faith-Based Mentoring Program, and our School Improvement Council exemplify this belief. We continue to be diligent in our efforts to work with all of our stakeholders to support school-wide programs and projects that meet the needs of students and ensure that Greenwood is a place where students grow, learn, excel and succeed.
