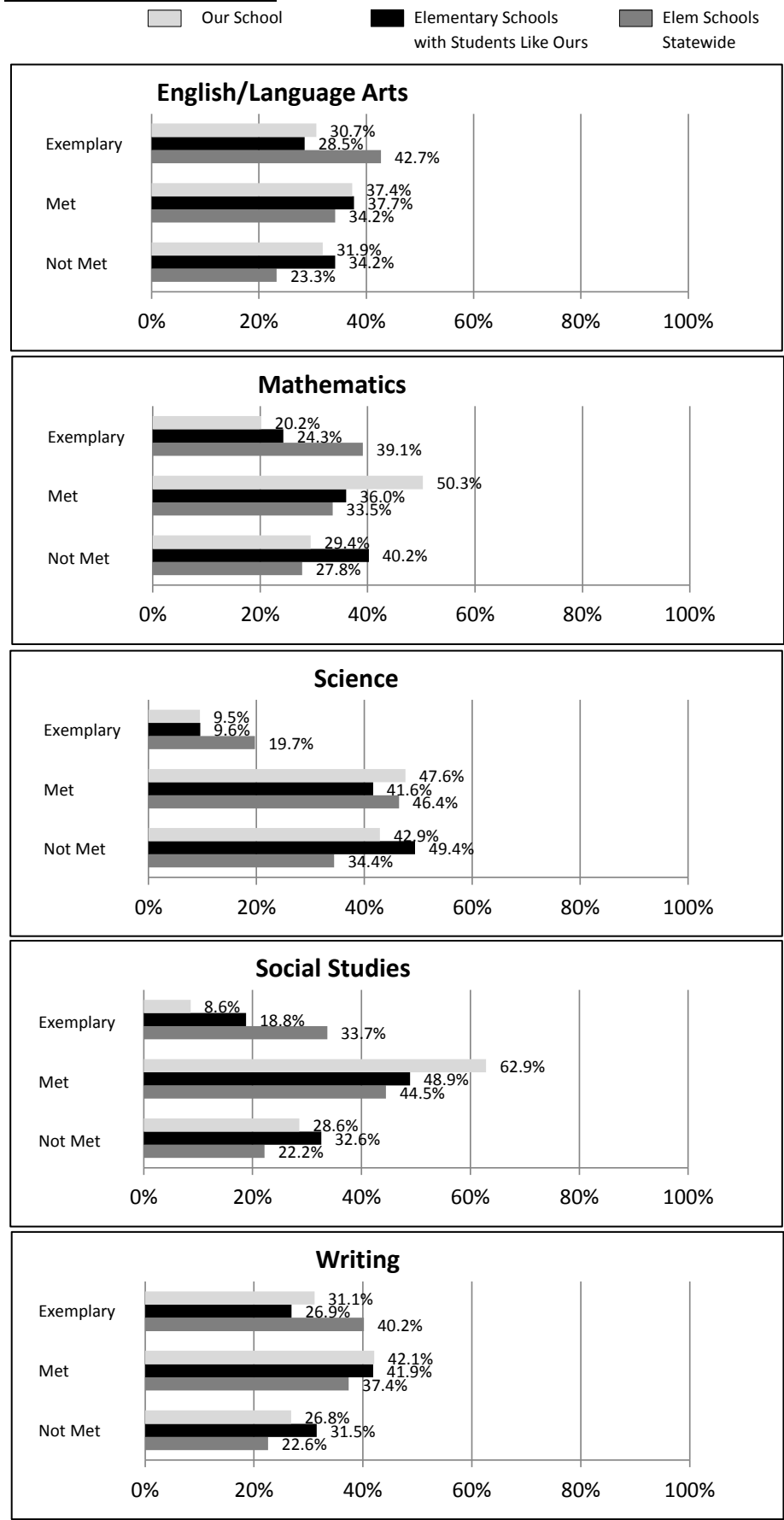

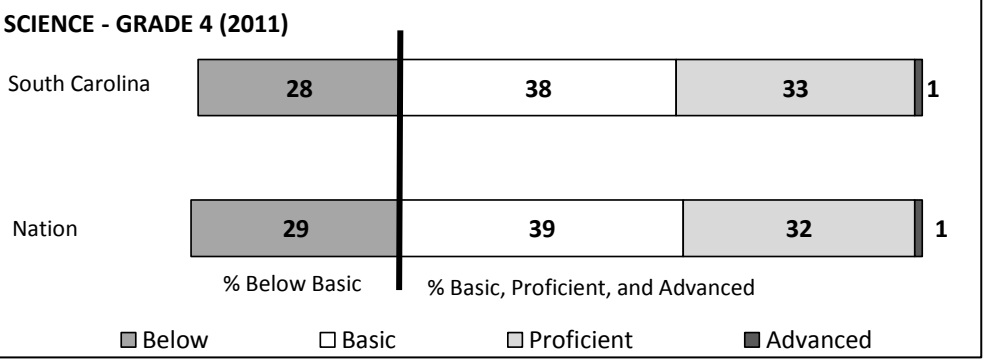

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

At Theodore Lester Elementary we are continuing to encourage our students to “Reach for the Stars.” We are challenging all students to reach their potential as learners. The school is regionally accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and nationally accredited by the Commission on International and Trans-Regional Accreditation.

This year we are continuing our focus on improving math skills. We will again implement our Math Academy where students will receive remediation in math. Students will meet after breakfast three days per week and after school three days per week. MAP test results will be used to identify students for the program.

We believe strongly that reading provides the foundation for all learning. We are implementing Reading Renaissance. With the program’s points system, we are encouraging students to read as much as possible. We want to instill in them a lifelong love of reading.

We are using student data to guide instruction and to narrow our focus on students’ individual weaknesses and strengths. We are using teacher observations, MAP data, Reading Renaissance data, and test results from PASS to help make decisions about what to teach and when to teach it, in order for students to be successful in mastering the curriculum standards in all subject areas.

The School Improvement Council has always been instrumental in improving parental involvement. We are using our improvement council for input in making important decisions about teaching and learning at our school.

The faculty and staff of Theodore Lester Elementary are committed to improving teaching and learning. Our vision for the school is to inspire in all the desire to learn and succeed. It is our vision that our school will be a safe learning community that celebrates our achievements and encourages active partnerships with families and the entire community. We will empower students to embrace the challenges and opportunities of the future.
