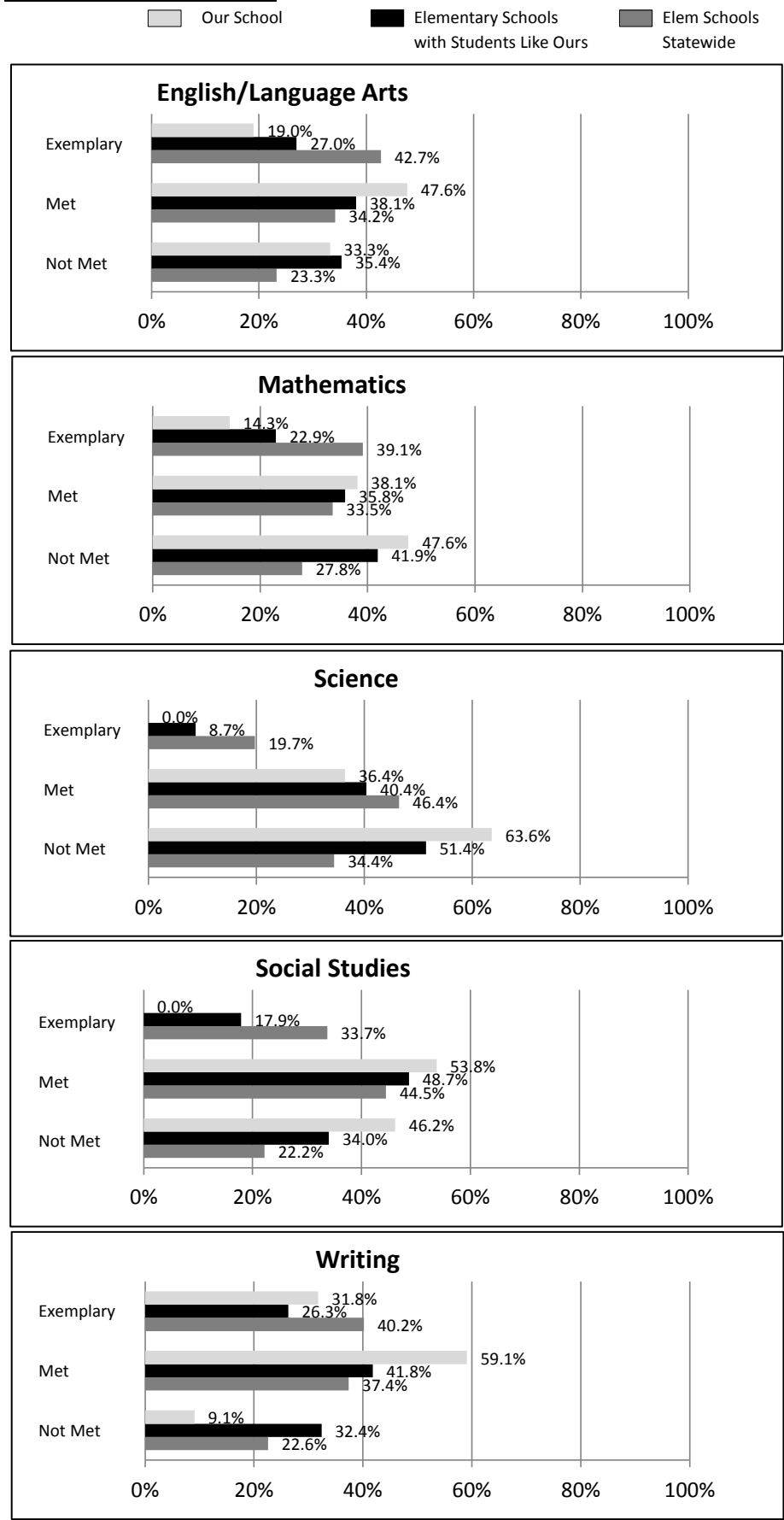

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

It is with sincere gratitude and excitement that we, the parents, students, and staff of Palmetto Youth Academy, PYA, inform the community about our schools progress during the 2013-2014 school year and our goals for the upcoming year.

Palmetto Youth Academy is a public charter school in Florence School District One. We offer grades 3 through 6 to a maximum of 75 students. Our mission is to provide an opportunity for all students, regardless of income or ability, to reach their full potential, academically, socially, and behaviorally. As we continue to carry out this challenging, yet rewarding mission, we are driven by our goals for 100 percent student success and we are sustained by our committment to parent choice and accountability. PYA has made tremendous academic progress throughout the 9 years in operation. During the 2012-2013 school year, PYA received a letter grade of B/89.9 on the school report card and last year, 2013-2014, PYA made even greater academic gains in ELA and Math. However, because PYA is a small school and only 46 students were enrolled in grades 3-6, no letter grade was reported on the 2013-2014 school report card. To continue making academic progress next year, 2014-2015, and to ensure student achievement among all subgroups, we will rely heavily on professional development, parental involvement, and community support.
