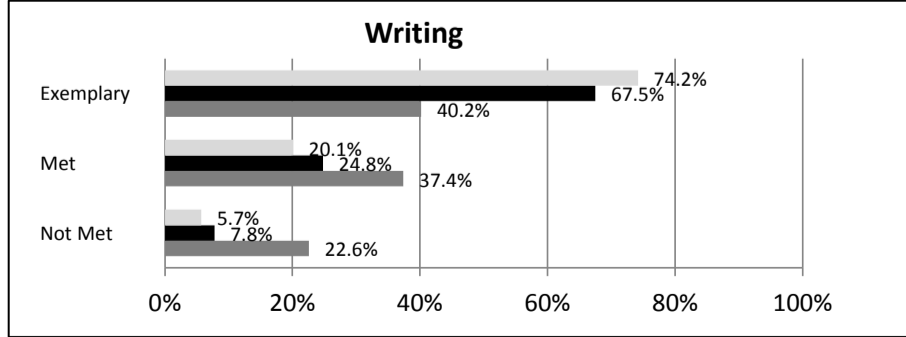

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2013-2014 school year was a very special year for New Providence. The year was filled with many exciting times as students continued "Leading and Learning in All Directions." During this sixth year at NPE, we were able to share a very special celebration with many our 104 graduating 5th graders who "came in with the bricks" as kindergarten students in August of 2008. These students have served as a cornerstone of our school and helped establish the tradition of excellence as NPE was again awarded the Palmetto Gold award by the South Carolina Department of Education for a 5th consecutive year. The NPE experience would not have been complete without mentioning the phrase "Lion Up". We kicked off the school year by adopting the "Lion Up" phrase to encourage our students and staff to persevere through challenging times and never give up.

Our learning environment, enhanced by the continued implementation of Lifelong Guidelines and Life Skills, again provided many exciting leading and learning opportunities for our students. Some of these events included STEM Safari, Arts Safari Week, NPE Rocks, Digital Learning Day, Project Unify, LEAD Time, and Green Team Recycling. The 3rd Annual NPE Leadership Day was a culmination of the mission of NPE and the effective collaboration of all stakeholders.

Even though this year was filled with many exciting times we still face many learning obstacles as we struggle with increasing class sizes and the implementation of new initiatives that often arise without adequate funding. We also are continuously trying to find methods and innovative strategies to motivate our high achieving learners while simultaneously providing research based interventions to our struggling students. Through the strong and continued support of our PTA, School Improvement Council, business partners, parents, and our dedicated faculty and staff, we are all committed to providing a high quality 21st Century learning environment for all students.

Academically, our NPE Lions continue to perform at high levels, consistently surpassing district and state averages for achievement. SCPASS data reveals that on average 93% of our students are meeting or exceeding state standards in the area of Math, ELA, Writing, Science, and Social Studies. Measures of Academic Progress(MAP) indicated that 93% of our students were performing proficient in reading while 95% were proficient in math.

A continued emphasis was also placed upon before- and after-school activities such as All Pro Dads, Girls on the Run, Soccer Shots, Run Hard, Lingo Foreign Language Camp, and iMoms. Through the collected effort and support of our PTA and School Improvement Council, students were also immersed in rich content through various field studies and school related events such as Patriot's Point, Columbia Museum of Art, Riverbanks Zoo, and multiple visits from the locally acclaimed artist Ernest Lee.
